Ask the Pastor

What is the difference between "Christ Jesus" and "Jesus Christ"; both are used in the **New Testament?**

In order to answer the question, we first have to understand the vocabulary...

"Jesus" is the human name given to the Son of God when he became incarnate and was born to Mary. In the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel it is Joseph who gives him this name at an angel's instruction. (In Luke's Gospel the angel tells Mary, but you get the idea.)

"Christ" is a title. It is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for "Messiah". It carries the meaning of "Anointed One" or "Chosen One". It would have been understood as the title of a God chosen king from the line of David, believed to be the one who would restore Israel to her glory.

You will... give birth to a son, and you are to give him

The given name plus the title indicates a more comprehensive identity of the Holy One of Israel than would the use of

the given name or just the title. However, either order, Jesus Christ or Christ Jesus, seem to have the same meaning. So the short answer to the question seems to be, there is no difference. If you find the short answer unsatisfying we can speculate...

Most of the New Testament writers use the name, followed by the title; i.e. "Jesus Christ" (the Gospel writers more often use just the title or name by itself when referring to Jesus). The inverted order "Christ Jesus", is used almost exclusively by Paul (1 out of 83 times it appears in the book Acts). One possible difference might be author's preference. There are some authors who speculate that Paul, who never physically walked with Jesus, uses "Christ Jesus" more than others as a more formal address. (Assuming that the inverse "Jesus Christ" is more casual?)

Another possible answer is that in many languages, word order can be changed for emphasis. So perhaps a particular biblical author would use the less common "Christ Jesus" to emphasize the "Chosen One" title of Jesus. However, scholars note that while statements in Greek are also subject to shifts in emphasis based on word order, the difference between "Jesus Christ" and "Christ Jesus" is slight.

I conclude with my original answer, there really is no difference. To use the title Christ on either side of the personal name Jesus is appropriate and biblical, and does not seem to communicate a different meaning.

As a closing note... in writing this article I discovered there are some really bizarre theories about this on the internet, so be warned if you search this out yourself.





Martin Luther: A Brief Word on Prayer

In 1535, Peter Beskendorf, a Wittenberg barber and friend, asked Martin Luther to teach him to pray. Luther responded with a letter entitled,

A Simple Way to Pray for Peter, the Master Barber.

In this letter Dr. Luther describes his own personal practice of prayer.

At the end of his explanation of the Lord's Prayer, Luther offers these words,

"Therefore, it's very clear that if a person is going to do something well, it requires him to focus and concentrate, as the old saying goes: pluribus intentus minor est ad singular sensus, that is, "a person engaged in many pursuits, does none of them well." So, if this is true about other things in our life, how much more does prayer require the heart to be completely focused if it is to pray a good prayer."

In Christian Sympathy

The Northwestern Ohio Synod expresses sympathy to the family and friends of

Bishop Festo Ngowo, who passed away into the arms of the Lord on Sunday, October 15, 2017. He was the Bishop of the Dodoma Diocese in Tanzania, East Africa.

The Northwestern Ohio Synod began a partnership with the Diocese of Dodoma Tanzania shortly after the forming of the ELCA. This began with the NWOS Bishop traveling with a group to Tanzania to visit the Bishop of Dodoma Diocese. For several years Rev. Festo Ngowo corresponded with Trinity Lutheran in Arcadia.

Trinity invited Rev. Ngowo to come and visit during a Lenten season. He worked with them during that time and also visited Winebrenner Seminary where he became interested in attending. Later, he returned and attended Winebrenner for two years. He lived at the City Mission in Findlay attending seminary, and serving as Trinity's assistant pastor.

In 2009 Rev. Festo Ngowo was selected by the Dodoma Diocese to be their Bishop and he was consecrated Bishop of Dodoma Diocese on November 8, 2009.

Services for Bishop Ngowo were held on Wednesday, October 18, 2017 where he was be buried in Dodoma.




