### **Ask the Pastor**

The question I have been asked most since returning is, "How was your trip to the Holy Land?"

It was fantastic! You can't help but have a deeper understanding of scripture as you read the Gospel stories *in the place* where they happened. Standing in the remains of the synagogue in Capernaum and reading what Jesus said when he was *in that place* is an amazing experience. Someone referred to the Holy Land as the "fifth gospel" and I thought that was a fitting description; the geography, the history, the liturgy, and the people all come together to inspire your faith in a new way. And not only the people who live there, we saw groups from Germany, Korea, France, and a few other places I couldn't identify by language. It's amazing to think that millions of people from all over the world have been coming to these places for thousands of years to walk where Jesus walked, or see where Jesus was born, or touch the empty tomb. It was certainly a trip of a lifetime. But honestly, I'm still processing the experience. I'm not sure I can really put it all into words! I keep coming back to Jesus' words in our Gospel reading this past week (1/15); he told Andrew and the other disciple, "Come and see". That's good advice in this case. For me it was being in the places, the "coming and seeing", that made this an incredible experience.

And on that note, I can't wait to bring friends back. I want everyone to be able to "come and see". Good Shepherd Travel was amazing, and I am looking to organize a trip in the summer of 2024 and would love for anyone who is interested to come to see the Holy Land with me! I would love to share this adventure with others!

## The follow-up question is, "Are you going to have a slide show or make a presentation about your trip?"

Yes! It was an incredible experience and I would love to tell people about my trip. Some of you saw some pictures on Facebook, but there are a few thousand more. Literally... 3,715 pictures to be exact. But I promise not to show you all of them. Megan suggested finding someone who could cater middle eastern food so we could have the full experience and I thought that was a great idea. We are working on making arrangements and will let you know when we schedule a date.





Scholarships for continuing education are available from St. John Lutheran Church. Applications may be picked up from • the church office and are also available on the church's website. The application deadline for all scholarships is March 31st, 2023. You may return the completed forms to the church office any time before that date. If you have any questions, • please contact a member of the scholarship committee: Pastor O'Brien, Deanna Neuman, and Al Brown.

Below is a brief summary of the scholarships available. The scholarship committee recommends that anyone that has graduated high school within the last five years take a close look at the application requirements. All eligible students are encouraged to apply.

#### TANK SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship was established in 1997 and is provided through the generosity of Carol Tank and the late Robert Tank
- In order to be eligible for this scholarship, the applicant must be an active voting member of St. John Lutheran Church for at least three years before the start of the college semester that the applicant is applying for this scholarship.
- The applicant must attend a four year accredited college or university.
- The scholarship is a one year scholarship for \$500 that can
   be applied for by the applicant for their first or second year.
- A second scholarship is available for those attending Capital University.

### ST. JOHN SCHOLARSHIP (Lutheran Partners)

- The purpose of this scholarship fund is to aid in the education of our students who will be attending an ELCA related college.
- The applicant must be a voting member of St. John Lutheran Church.
- The grant will be \$500 for each qualified student contingent upon the dollars available in the scholarship fund.

#### YOUNKER SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship began in 2006 and is made available by an annual contribution from the Younker Scholarship Fund and is solely dependent on that annual contribution for the scholarship program to continue.
- The student must be a confirmed church member who is actively involved in the life of the Church and who demonstrates their faith.
- Recipient will be a recent high school graduate. Recent defined as within five years of the date of the beginning of the school year.
- The student will attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.

### EARL JOHNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship was established in January 2016 from a portion of Earl's estate bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.
- The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church during their high school years.
- Scholarship value will be up to \$1,000 and determined by the applicant's church worship attendance as well as church and community activities.
- The applicant must attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.
- Applicants must me a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the date of the beginning of the school year.
- Recipients can apply more than once, but can only receive the scholarship once.
- Scholarship recipient and value will be determined by the St. John scholarship committee.

#### PHYLLIS PARKS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Phyllis Parks Scholarship Fund was established in August, 2016 from the estate of Martin Parks bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

- The maximum individual scholarship will be \$1,000.
- The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church.
- Special preference will be given to the applicant's church worship attendance.







Welcome to 2023: The Year of Story. We recently had our grandchildren visit with us, and in the evening as they prepared for bed, the request came every night. "Read us a story. Tell us a story".

I love stories and I love storytellers: Ernest Hemingway, William Faulkner, John Steinbeck, Norman Maclean, but also Louise Penny, Colson Whitehead, and Louise Erdrich. Who would you add to the list of great storytellers?

In addition to those listed above, I would add Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The writers of the four Gospels. And lest we forget... Jesus. Jesus could spin a yarn. Jesus could tell a tale. Jesus could narrate a great story. And Jesus also knows how to star in a great story.

Our focus in 2023: The Year of Story will be on learning and telling the Story of Jesus. A story that many of us have been learning and telling our entire lives. The Gospel Story of Jesus matters. As St. Paul reminds us in Romans 1:16, the Gospel "...is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith...".

The stories of Jesus that I learned in Sunday School, heard proclaimed from the pulpit, read in my illustrated Children's Bible, loomed huge in my imagination when I was a kid. And that's what great stories do. They loom. They challenge. And they inspire. Great stories have a way of enlightening our minds, moving our hearts, healing our relationships, and transforming whole communities.

During 2023: The Year of Story, I want to encourage you and your parish to learn and tell the transforming Story of Jesus.

Let us pray, "Blessed Lord God, you have caused the holy scriptures to be written for the nourishment of your people. Grant that we may hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that, comforted by your promises, we may embrace and forever hold fast to the hope of eternal life, which you have given us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord". Amen. (Evangelical Lutheran Worship pg. 72)

As we begin 2023: The Year of Story, I invite you to start with two simple practices related to the Story of Jesus.

Memorize Scripture: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth". Acts 1:8 is the Year of Story Memory Verse.

Read Scripture: Join a host of others across the Northwestern Ohio Synod as we focus on the Story of Jesus! In 2023, we will read through the writing of the Four Evangelists: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. This week we are working our way through the Birth Narratives of Jesus.

Financial Secretary, Treasurer & Finance

Committee Report: Expenses: We are 86% of the monthly budget and 91% of the year to date budget. Income: We are 135% of our monthly budget and 98% of our year to date budget. Made modifications for the proposed budget (operating expenses adjusted to increase water and property tax budget lines and decrease telephone budget lines based on further info received after the Dec council mtg.) The overall budget is staying the same and it balances out with the increase and decreases between the areas. There is an \$8169 income overage from 2022 and that income will go into the Endowment Fund to use for future outreach. \$1981 was made in interest from the Endowment Fund and that has to be distributed each year. Jennifer Nelson motioned to recommend that the \$8169 income overage

be put the En-





dowment Fund at the annual mtg and Kristina Wildman seconded the motion, motion passed. Jennifer Nelson motioned to donate the interest from the Endowment Fund of \$1981 to the Luther Home of Mercy, Elliston Zion Neighborhood, and Nightingale's Harvest split evenly. Gary Johnson seconded motion, motion passed.

### **Christian Community Life:** Susie Mathews

Food pantry: Donations for Dec were \$4,167.50. They still need someone from St. John to sit on the board. Discussed the meal for the Annual Congregational meeting on Feb. 22nd. Flyers and sign up sheets for Shrove Pancake supper on Feb. 21st are being made and will be posted soon.

Discussed the date for Lenten Lunch this year.

Soup kettles will be out the Feb 11th & 12th services for SouperBowl Sunday. Donations are collected for the Genoa Food Pantry. 
