If you would like to submit a question for "Ask the Pastor", Biblical, theological, church related, anything you have been dying to ask a pastor, you can hand me a note, ask me after church, send an e-mail, or sneak into the church after dark and anonymously slide a sealed envelope under my office door. If I answer your question in print, I will not include your name unless you explicitly ask me to.

Ask the Pastor

"Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. Whoever welcomes a prophet in the name of a prophet will receive a prophet's reward; and whoever welcomes a righteous person in the name of a righteous person will receive the reward of the righteous; and whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple--truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward." (Matthew 10:40-42)

A few weeks ago, we read this Gospel passage during worship. I noted that when we don't welcome strangers we miss an opportunity to welcome God (whoever welcomes you welcomes me...). If that's the case, our welcome should not be a matter of how we feel, what we want, or what would be embarrassing. Nor is our hospitality a matter of building church membership or even a matter of earning the title 'world's friendliest church' (if there even is such a thing). Being welcoming, showing hospitality to strangers, is a matter of God's love. It's a matter of not missing the opportunity to share that radical love shown to us through the life of Jesus. It's about not missing the opportunity to share the sacrificial love shown to us on the cross. And not missing the opportunity to share the ultimate love shown to us in the resurrection. When all is said and done, that love is why we do what we do; it is our purpose. Our purpose in this church and on this earth is to take every opportunity we have to share God's love. We should try not to miss the opportunity.

There was also an announcement related to that reflection on welcoming...

In June, the O'Briens went to a niece's confirmation in Avon, OH. I noticed a sign above one of the church doors reading "Sanctuary Entrance". I thought that was a really good idea for people who might not be familiar with the building. It made me reflect... sometimes we become so familiar with a place that we don't think about those who might not know where to go, which door to use, etc. When I come to St. John, I know which door to use. But do visitors? Do new people know how to get to the sanctuary? Do they know where the bathrooms are? It's obvious to us because we call this place home, but what do visitors see?

Sometimes being welcoming can be as simple as signage. We need to spend some time talking about those things, but in the meantime, I could use your help... If you travel this summer or visit other congregations, note what they do that you find helpful as a visitor. It could be a sign outside telling you which door to use, maps to the bathrooms, directions in a bulletin, or anything that might be helpful to visitors. Take a picture if you can. If taking a picture is not convenient, jot down some notes and share their ideas with me. I would love to collect your ideas.



Blessing of Backpacks






Prayers for departing College Students






Thy will be done


- still,

 - We ask this through Christ, Our Lord. **Amen.**



Dear Friends in Christ,

Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. *Luke* 15:7

Recently, I had the opportunity to travel with a delegation from the Northwestern Ohio Synod to the Dodoma Diocese of Tanzania for the consecration of Bishop Christian Ndossa. This was a time of high



celebration. The community welcomed honored guests (us) and many local dignitaries (the Vice President!).

As a first-time ocean crosser, I had no idea what to expect. But the moment my feet touched the dust of Dodoma, this rural Ohioan was made to feel at home. Our group was joyfully serenaded with voices and instruments. We were fed until our stomachs were over-capacity, danced until we couldn't stand, and given beautiful gifts reflective on Tanzanian culture. But most of all... we were told, "you are welcome". Over and over.... with hugs and handshakes, we were told, "you are welcome". And they meant it!

It made me think of all of the times as an American, I have uttered phrases that are culturally expected but had no true intent behind what I said. I would probably be embarrassed if I counted how often I've responded "bless you" to a sneeze or "you are welcome" to some minor courtesy only to have my actions or sentiment go no farther than my lips. And I don't think I am alone. And I think this lackluster response... at times... extends into the walls of our churches.

If you've been around ministry long enough, you've probably heard of or attended a parish that says they value youth but don't invite them to participate in the daily life of the church. Or those who want young families to join but glare at mothers when their babies cry. Or who say that all people are welcome but have worship times that are impossible to find.

The true purpose of my visit to Dodoma was to meet Peter Kayombo, a young man with a brilliant proposal to begin doing the work of disability ministry in his country. In many ways, Peter's vision mirrors work that began at Luther Home of Mercy 95 years ago. I believe that Peter will achieve his dream for others. And it starts by gathering his people around those with intellectual and developmental disabilities... and over and over... with hugs and handshakes telling them, "you are welcome"... and mean it!

I wonder what northwest Ohio would look like if we all made a commitment to do the same.


