As you know, the book of Genesis starts with the story of God creating the universe, the world, and everything in it. As we go through the creation story, there is a pattern... God creates something and then says that it is good. Seven times Genesis says "God saw that it was good."

Now the Hebrew word for good is "tov" and can mean "goodness" or "beauty." That means when God created land and vegetation and creepy crawling things and "God saw that it was good" it doesn't just mean that creation was morally good or working properly, but that it was inherently beautiful. Creation was gorgeous, a work of art flowing from God's love.

And consider... in the Genesis narrative humans don't arrive on the scene until the very end. That means, "God saw that it was good" six times before Adam or Eve or art critics or theologians even showed up. God's work of creation was beautiful with or without external appraisal. I think that tells us that there is inherent value in art and beauty even if there is no one there to see it.

And by extension, I suspect if that means if you create a work of art, whether a mural, or a painting, or short story, or novel, or song, or sculpture, or dance, or musical piece, or poetry... if you create a work of art, and no one sees it — no one but you and God—that that's enough.

In our world we typically define how good something is by how much we can sell it for. In our "utilitarian" way of viewing art; it's like art is a product. We tend to think the really good art is what sells at Sotheby's for millions of dollars. But the Bible tells us God values creation and beauty by its very nature. God created a whole bunch of things (stars, land, vegetation, animals) that did not receive an excellent rating on Rotten Tomato or Billboard magazine. God created a whole bunch of things that could not audibly speak of him. Only through their nature and beauty could they speak of God and God love. And God saw them as good. Art and beauty have inherent worth.

So I hope, in the future, when we see the beauty of creation... will be reminded of God the artist. I hope that you will see all of creation as goodness flowing from God's own love. That not just natural creation, but all created works of art will remind you of the sacredness of all things

And that, you will remember the inherent worth of art and beauty. Because we need to feed our souls sometimes, too.





#### MAUI DISASTER RELIEF

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone, To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

1 Corinthians 12:4-7

I have always found joy in celebrating our spiritual gifts. One of my own is language, and I use my gift and passion for it in a way that helps me connect to the larger body of Christ and enter into sacred space with those around me. In preparation for the recent visit to our companions in Tanzania, I started to learn some basic Swahili, knowing that it would be a joy and honor to use my spiritual gift while communicating in someone else's mother tongue. I loved being able to use this gift during our time

in Tanzania, but I also received an important reminder that these gifts and strengths are not our own doing but are rooted in the loving grace of our God.

I had the joy of joining a congregation for worship on our second Sunday in Tanzania and when i realized that I would be helping to serve communion, I turned to the assisting minister, Frank, and asked him what words I would need to serve communion in Swahili. He quickly taught me, "Twa mwili wa Kristo," or "the body of Christ," in between prayers at the start of the service, so that I could repeat it in my head until it was time to serve. Eventually the time came, and everything was going perfectly! I felt so much joy in the Spirit, serving this tangible gift of God's grace to those at the rail and speaking those promises aloud in their mother tongue. I was overwhelmed by the sacredness of each encounter. But, as I said before, we must remember these gifts are rooted in the grace of our God, not in anything we have done on our own.

As we finished serving the congregation, the time came to serve the worship leaders. It was at that point that I realized three of the four of us had knelt at the rail, and only one of us still had elements in their hand to serve - me. I served the wafers to these other leaders in Swahili, and then picked up the wine, went to serve it... and realized I did not have the Swahili words. After a moment of hesitation, I said the words in English, and then I knelt at the rail to be served myself.

Perhaps in another scenario I might have been ashamed or embarrassed or gotten down on myself for not being enough, but in that particular moment, I was much too grateful for our God who speaks to each through promises beyond language. My gifts with language may have felt insufficient to me in the moment, but the Good News is that is was never my own power that mattered in the first place, it was always reliant on the gift of God. The relationships, the bread, the wine, each provided sacred, holy space because of the God who was present within them, not because of anything I could or could not do. It is true that we each possess a variety of Spiritual Gifts to use in our lives following Christ, but how wonderful to remember the gift of grace that is offered to all through Jesus Christ. A gift that is offered as a constant companion and foundation, so that even when we feel like we have failed with our own gifts, we always have a God who was there all along, grounding us in promises of grace.

Food pantry report for June and July: Gas line is complete for the driveway, just waiting for Bergman to finish putting in stone. Peaches were given out in July to patrons. Meijer was out of the ones on sales and once again helped by giving us the more expensive ones. The pantry is doing a rotation on meat of pork chops, beef roast, smoked sausage and turkey. Since eggs are down, we will be able to give out 2 dozen again. The Spring Simply Give Program raised a total of \$18,160.00. Double match raised \$8,380.00 and \$4,680.00 from the LPGA. The pantry is getting thank you cards for the patrons to sign. Counts for June: patrons-58, families-32 donations \$2,488:12. Plus a grant of \$10,000.00 and expenses \$2,529.70. Counts for July: patrons-67, families-32 donations \$250.00, expenses

\$1,035.67. We will be serving a luncheon on Sept 10th for the Gods Helping Hands. It is our turn to serve the food pantry on Sept 16th. And we need to prepackage the food on Wed Sept 13th. Help is needed for both days. We filled 75 backpacks with supplies, 25 have been given to Genoa Schools. We will be doing the sack for a sack.
