Ask the Pastor

“Does God really ‘forgive and forget’?”

I once heard a story about a German family who adopted a boy after the war. When they found him, he was an orphan; dirty, ragged, with shoes full of holes. They gave him new clothes and new shoes, but they kept the old ones on a shelf. Whenever the boy misbehaved, his father would pull them down and remind him how bad things once were, and how much the family had done for him.

When the pastor came to visit, the boy sat in shame. And the pastor thought to himself, *What a blessing it is that God does not continually drag out our old shoes.*

forgive and forget?

That’s the good news. Jesus tells of a shepherd who leaves ninety-nine sheep to find the one that was lost, and a woman who sweeps her house to find one coin. And when the lost is found, there is great joy.

Notice something important: in these parables, it isn’t the sheep who find the shepherd, or the coin who rolls its way back to the woman. It is the shepherd who searches. It is the woman who seeks. It is God who comes looking for us.

We often think, *If I repent, then God will forgive me.* But Jesus flips that around. We don’t repent in order to be forgiven. We repent because we already are forgiven. Repentance isn’t the price – it’s the response.

That’s who we are: forgiven people. Lost and found. Sheep carried home on the shoulders of a joyful shepherd. Coins held high in celebration.

WE are the ones who refuse to forget. We keep dragging down our old shoes. We replay our sins and failures when God has already let them go. We hold others’ past against them even though God does not hold ours against us. God doesn’t keep score, and neither should we.

Friends, the good news is this: God has searched, God has found, God has forgiven. And all of heaven is rejoicing. God chooses not to remember our sin. That is how completely forgiven we are.

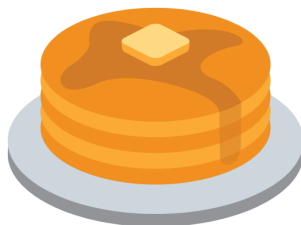

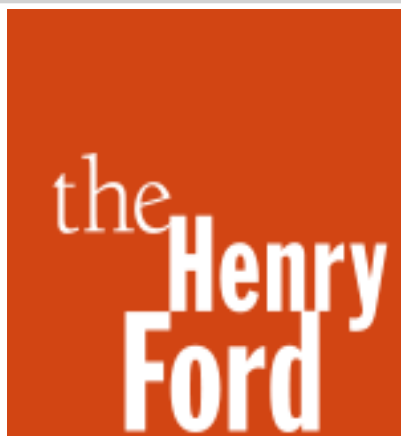


CHANGES TO WINTER WEATHER POLICY

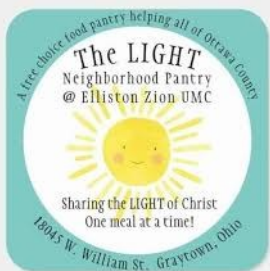
*If Ottawa County is under a **Level 2 or Level 3** Snow Emergency, we will **not** have worship or any other church related activities until the emergency has been cancelled.

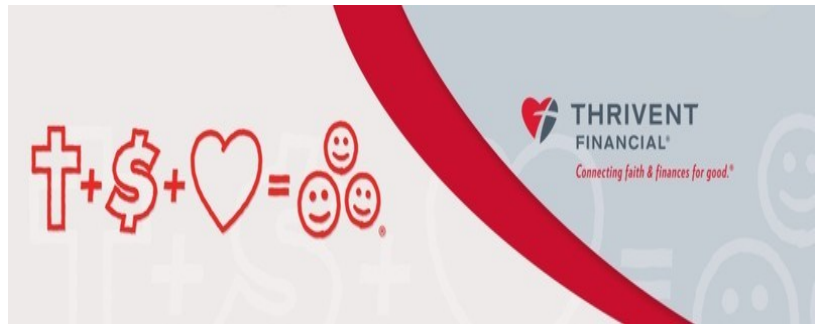
McDonalds Breakfast

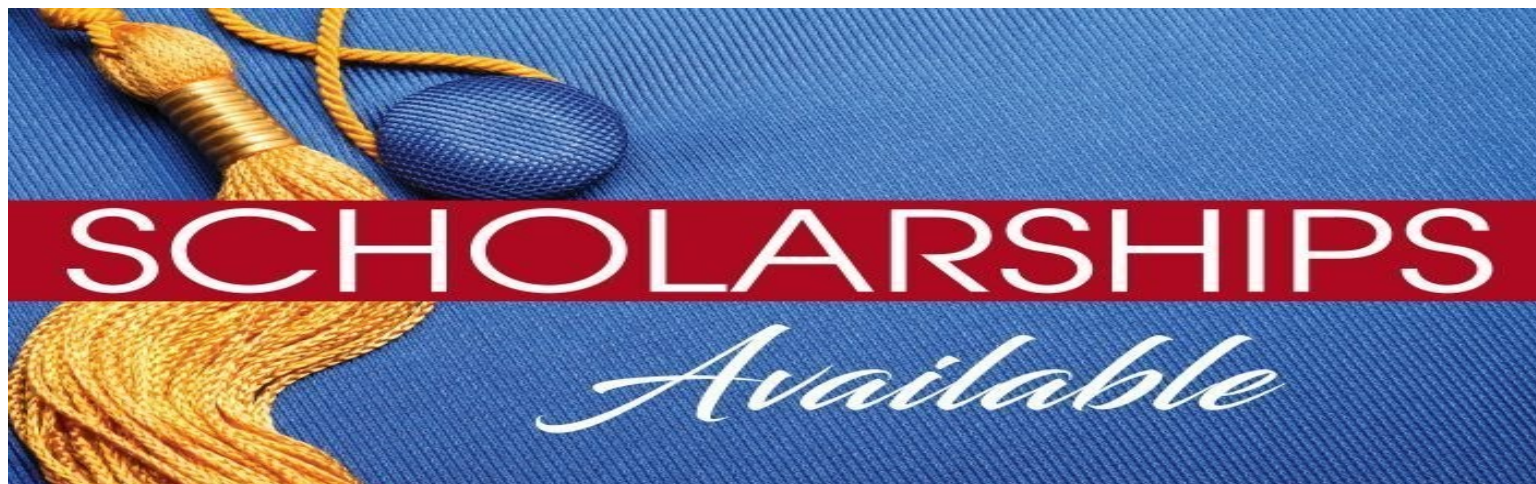
The "Blanket Ladies" gather to make quilts on

Below is a brief summary of the scholarships available. The scholarship committee recommends that anyone that has graduated high school within the last five years take a close look at the application requirements. All eligible students are encouraged to apply.

CURRENTLY AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Tank Scholarship Fund

This scholarship fund was established in 1997 by a gift to St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church, Williston, Ohio by the late Carol L. Tank and Robert M. Tank.

Any high school graduate who is a three-year confirmed active member of St. John may receive one grant in their first or second year during their attendance at a four-year accredited college or university. Students attending Capital University, Columbus, Ohio may receive a second grant during their fourth year there.

The scholarship value will be \$500.

Phyllis Parks Endowed Scholarship Fund

The Phyllis Parks Scholarship Fund was established in August 2016 from the estate of Martin Parks bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

The scholarship principal and interest distributions of the funds shall be made annually over twenty (20) years with approximately one twentieth (1/20) distributed each year. The maximum individual scholarship will be \$1,000. The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church.

Special preference will be given to the applicant's church worship attendance. The applicant must attend an accredited four (4) year college or university seeking a bachelor's degree. The applicant must be a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the school year's start date.

Scholarships will be for one year. Prior recipients may reapply.

Earl Johnson Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Earl Johnson Scholarship Fund was established in January 2016 from a portion of Earl's estate bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church during their high school years.

Scholarship value will be up to \$1,000 and determined by the applicant's church worship attendance as well as church and community activities.

While the applicant's GPA will be requested and is important, the activities noted above will carry more emphasis in the decision process.

The applicant must attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.

The applicant must be a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the school year's start date.

Recipients can apply more than once but can only receive the scholarship once.

Yunker Scholarship Fund

This scholarship is funded by an annual gift from Marlin and Linda Yunker. Awards are contingent upon receiving these funds.

The applicant will be a confirmed St. John member who is actively involved in the life of the church and who demonstrates their faith.

The opportunity to receive this scholarship is enhanced by the student working at least summers, but also preferably in a part-time position during the school year. Exceptions can be made.

The applicant should maintain at least a "C" or 2.0 grade average.

The applicant will attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.

The applicant must be a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the school year's start date.

Recipient of the Yunker Scholarship is not eligible for any other church scholarship in the same year.

St. John ELCA Scholarship Fund

Applicant must be a member of St. John Lutheran Church.

The scholarship will be available to all students meeting the requirements of attending an ELCA owned college. The scholarship is \$500 each year and will be considered each additional year up to and including four years. Awards are contingent on fund availability with preference given to first year applicants.

Generosity It has nothing to do with means and everything to do with desire



There's an old tale of a monk who found a precious gemstone. He picked it up and put it in his knapsack and carried it with his few other belongings. One day he struck up a conversation with a traveler. When the monk opened his knapsack to share some food, the traveler saw the jewel and asked the monk to give it to him. The monk did so readily.

The traveler went on his way, overjoyed by this unexpected gift that would bring wealth and security for the rest of his life.

After a few days, however, the traveler returned in search of the monk. Once he found him, he immediately gave the stone back and begged of the holy man: "Please give me something much more precious than this stone, as valuable as it is. Give me that which enabled you to give it to me."

The particular feature of this monk that captures our attention is his generous spirit. Not his generous *deed* of giving away something precious, but his generous *spirit* that appears to shape his entire outlook on life. I like to distinguish these two aspects of generosity. Any of us is capable of carrying out a kind or charitable deed. All it takes is a soft moment, brought on by a compelling grab at our emotions, and our hands and wallets open wide. But a person who enjoys little spasms of generosity is not the same as one who is generous to the bone.

A life steeped in generosity pours out love unconsciously. This is a person whose instinct for generosity is second nature or, as Jesus put it, reacts in a way that "your left hand [doesn't] know what your right hand is doing" ([Matthew 6:3](#)). These are the righteous ones in the parable of the final judgment, who seem surprised to learn that their reflexive kindness defined them. "When was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you ...?" ([Matthew 25:38](#)).

The most startling dimension of generosity may be the irrelevance of extensive means. Generosity has nothing to

do with means, and everything to do with desire. The poorest of the poor can be as generous in spirit as the richest of the rich. The widow in the temple who gave her last two coins is emblematic of one whose desire runs deep. So are the men whom Holocaust survivor Viktor Frankl remembers walking through the barracks comforting others and giving away their last piece of bread.

When 5,000 people sat hungry before Jesus one day, the disciples saw only scarcity. They proposed a go-it-alone strategy for resolving the crisis. Everyone in the crowd was to head home and fend for him or herself. Jesus stepped in to transform their frugal thinking into the mystery of abundance. Breaking open five loaves and sharing two fish would provide enough for all.

It can be hard to see how generosity fuels abundance, especially in a world where doctrines of fairness and reciprocation hold center stage. "There is no free lunch," we hear. "You get what you deserve." So what do you make of people who love you more than you deserve? And what about God who forgives you in more ways than you can comprehend or repay?

A deep generosity in the heart of God easily puzzles. We grouse when others seem to land a better deal in life than we do. There is a payroll manager in Scripture who looks and behaves strangely like God. When he says to his disgruntled friends, "Are you envious because I am generous?" we ought to sit up and pay close attention ([Matthew 20:15](#)).

Anyone can learn to be generous in life. It is, after all, one of the nine fruits of the Spirit in [Galatians 5](#). From those who have cultivated this fruit so well, I have drawn the following conclusions: Truly grateful people tend to be generous people. And generous people tend to be really happy people.

I don't have scientific evidence to prove as much — just a lot of anecdotal evidence to confirm it. I have never met a generous soul who is a grump. Should you ever encounter one, however, take a good second look. You won't want to confuse bursts of charity with bone-deep generosity.

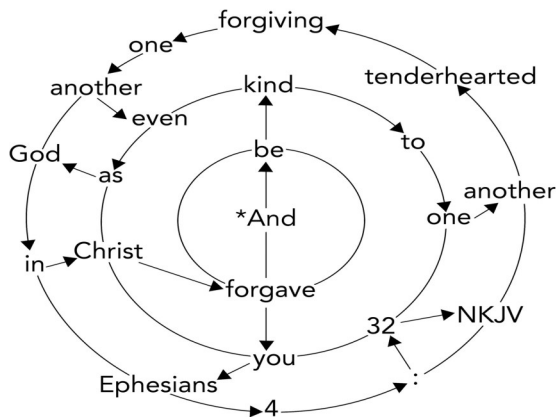

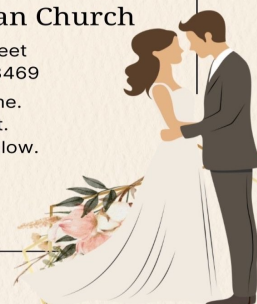

Welcome to 2026: The Way of Love!

**As our scripture verse for this year reminds us,
“We love because he first loved us.” (1 John 4:19).
As we journey together with Jesus, we have the
great opportunity to encourage each other to grow
in both our appreciation for, and reflection of,
the love of God.**

WHAT IS LOVE? By Bishop Daniel Beaudoin

“We love because he first loved us.” (1 John 4:19) What is Love? Love is a gift from God that calls us to imitate the self-giving love of Jesus, which transforms us, to transform the community and the world! In July, 2000, I was blessed to gather with over 35,000 young people for the ELCA Youth Gathering in St. Louis, Missouri. One of the main speakers was Archbishop Desmond Tutu from South Africa. It was at this gathering where I first heard about the South African principle of "Ubuntu" which is translated, "I am because we are." Archbishop Tutu taught us that when the love of God is combined with the power of "we," the result is the healing and transformation of the community and the world. The Apostle John understands both the gift of God's love and the power of "we". In 1 John 4:7-19, John teaches the community of faith that God is love, and as followers of Jesus we are called to imitate God's self-giving love, not only as individuals, but also as a community of faith. Notice that 1 John 4:19, does not begin with a "me", but with a "we". "We" are called to love, in the same way that God, in Christ Jesus, loves us. The love that John writes about is a love that begins with God, a love that we are called to imitate: a love that changes the community and the world. In his book, *Love Is the Way: Holding on to Hope in Troubling Times*, Episcopal Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, helps us to put God's self-giving love into perspective. He simply asks, "Is this love about me, or is it about we?" Does the decision that I am about to make serve my own self-interest, or might this decision serve the greater good? If the answer is "me, myself, and I," the way of love calls us to reconsider our next step. According to Presiding Bishop Curry, Archbishop Tutu, the Apostle John, and Jesus, we embrace the "we" before the "me," for that is the way of love. And it can be that simple... and also that challenging. But at the end of the day, love is the only way. "We love because He first loved us".

1. In 1 John 4:7-19, the writer reminds the church about the self-giving love of God. How is this self-giving love lived out in your community of faith? .

2. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, the Apostle John, and Jesus all call us to a love that puts the "we" before the "me". Why do you think this self-giving love is so challenging for us to live out? Can you think of a story of a time you experienced this kind of love in your life? In the life of your parish?

Let us pray:

Gracious and Loving God, we thank you for the gift of Your love, and we seek Your forgiveness, when we fail to love as we are loved. Fill us with Your gentle and self-giving love, so that we might share it with others. Empower us to forgive, to serve, and to follow you in the way of love. Lead us to share Your love with our neighbor and the world, transforming us from who we are, into the people You long for us to be. In the name of Jesus, crucified and risen for the world. Amen.

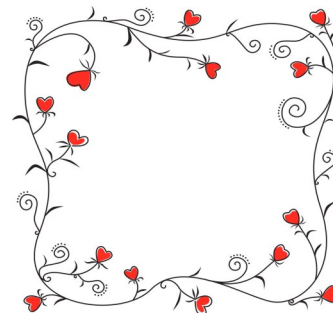
