Ask the Pastor

"Why is Easter (Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, and Lent in general) so late this year?"

First some set up... The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday (March 6th this year) and concludes on Easter (April 21st). The season of Lent represents the forty days Christ spent in the wilderness immediately following his baptism. But... if you actually count them, you will see that there are forty-SIX days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. The discrepancy occurs because all Sundays – not just Easter Sunday – are days to celebrate Christ's Resurrection. Christians in the early church were therefore forbidden to fast and do other forms of penance on those Holy days. Ergo, the six Sundays in Lent are excluded from the "regular" Lenten observances, leaving us with forty days.

Now to actually answer the question... Easter is what we call a "moveable feast". It does not occur on the same date every year. (Thus associated Holy Days like Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, Pentecost, etc. are also "moveable" based on the date of Easter.) The date for Easter was determined by the Council of Nicaea (325 AD); they set the date of Easter as the Sunday following the full moon that falls on or after the spring equinox (which happened to be March 20th this year). But here's where things get confusing (or perhaps more confusing)... This year, the full moon was on the same day as the spring equinox. So strictly following the rules would mean Easter *should* have been on March 24th, but of course it wasn't. So what going on? The full moon used to determine the date of Easter is not the astronomical full moon (the one we observe by looking in the night sky) but an ecclesiastical moon (determined from tables) that keeps, more or less, in step with the astronomical moon. And, on the astrological calendar the date of the equinox actually changes; it can be anywhere between March 19 and 21, but on the church calendar, the equinox is always March 21st. (And I thank God for Google so I don't have to go through all this to figure out the date of Easter each year.)

The bottom line is that Easter can never occur before March 22nd or later than April 25th. So this year, with Easter on the 21st of April, it's pretty late. And, in case you were curious, Easter will fall on its latest date April 25th in 2038.

If you would like to submit a question for "Ask the Pastor", Biblical, theological, church related, anything you have been dying to ask a pastor, you can hand me a note, ask me after church, send an e-mail, or sneak into the church after dark and anonymously slide a sealed envelope under my office door. If I answer your question in print, I will not include your name unless you explicitly ask me to.





The "Blanket Ladies" gather to make quilts on Tuesday mornings at 10:00 am.



SCHOLARSHIPS Available

Scholarships for continuing education are available from St. John Lutheran Church. Applications may be picked up from • the church office and are also available on the church's website. **The application deadline for all scholarships is April 28**, **2019.** You may return the completed forms to the church office any time before that date. **If you have any questions**, • **please contact a member of the scholarship committee: Pastor O'Brien, Carol Jensen, Deanna Neuman, and Al Brown**.

Below is a brief summary of the scholarships available. The scholarship committee recommends that anyone that has graduated high school within the last five years take a close look at • the application requirements. All eligible students are encouraged to apply.

TANK SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship was established in 1997 and is provided through the generosity of Carol Tank and the late Robert Tank.
- In order to be eligible for this scholarship, the applicant must be an active voting member of St. John Lutheran Church for at least three years before the start of the college semester that the applicant is applying for this scholarship.
- The applicant must attend a four year accredited college or university.
- The scholarship is a one year scholarship for \$500 that can
 be applied for by the applicant for their first or second year.
- A second scholarship is available for those attending Capi- tal University.

ST. JOHN SCHOLARSHIP (Lutheran Partners)

- The purpose of this scholarship fund is to aid in the education of our students who will be attending an ELCA related college.
- The applicant must be a voting member of St. John Lutheran Church.
- The grant will be \$500 for each qualified student contingent upon the dollars available in the scholarship fund.

YOUNKER SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship began in 2006 and is made available by an annual contribution from the Younker Scholarship Fund and is solely dependent on that annual contribution for the scholarship program to continue.
- The student must be a confirmed church member who is actively involved in the life of the Church and who demonstrates their faith.
- Recipient will be a recent high school graduate. Recent defined as within five years of the date of the beginning of the school year.
- The student will attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.

EARL JOHNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship was established in January 2016 from a portion of Earl's estate bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.
- The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church during their high school years.
- Scholarship value will be up to \$1,000 and determined by the applicant's church worship attendance as well as church and community activities.
- The applicant must attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.
- Applicants must me a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the date of the beginning of the school year.
- Recipients can apply more than once, but can only receive the scholarship once.
- Scholarship recipient and value will be determined by the St. John scholarship committee.

PHYLLIS PARKS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Phyllis Parks Scholarship Fund was established in August, 2016 from the estate of Martin Parks bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

- The maximum individual scholarship will be \$1,000.
- The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church.
- Special preference will be given to the applicant's church worship attendance.

ELCA presiding bishop pastoral message on Christ Church mosque shootings

Dear Church,

Today we awoke to the devastating news of the mass shootings at two mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand. We join in mourning for the people who were killed and wounded, for their families, for the first responders and grief counselors, and for all whose lives have been shattered today. We know that God is present in the midst of their suffering.

We know that our own Muslim neighbors here in the U.S. are also experiencing grief and fear. Many will wonder whether it is safe to attend Friday prayers today. These are not the kinds of questions that any of us should have to ask ourselves as we seek to live out our religious commitments. Yet, devastatingly, this is also a reality that binds us together as people of faith. As I wrote last November in the wake of the Tree of Life shooting: "Hate-filled violence knows no bounds – whether a Sikh Temple in Oak Creek, a Christian church in Charleston, a Jewish synagogue in Pittsburgh" – and now these mosques in New Zealand.

Together with our ecumenical and inter-religious partners, we stand shoulder to shoulder in condemning hatred, bigotry, racism and violence whenever and wherever it occurs. We do so because all people are made in the image of God. Therefore, as an act of neighborly love, I urge you to reach out to your Muslim neighbors today and in the days to come to ask how you might offer solidarity and support – joining whenever possible with other ecumenical and inter-religious neighbors.

I leave you with the words of Psalm 16:1: "Protect me, O God, for in you I take refuge." This is my prayer – for our Muslim neighbors, for the people of Christchurch, and for all who mourn and are afraid. May we see in this devastation the possibility to be Christ's presence with our neighbors in this world – to be present in their suffering and to be partners in God's justice and peace.

Dear Friends in Christ,

"So, he (Jesus) came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well. It was about noon. A Samaritan woman came to draw water,

and Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." (John 4:5-7). During our pilgrimage to the Holy Land, we stopped in the city of Nablus on the West Bank. We entered St. Photini Greek Orthodox Church, proceeded down to the crypt, and gathered around Jacob's Well. Jacob's Well is deep (over 130 feet), and the water that we drew was cool and sweet. As my daughter Hannah drank from a shared tin cup, I thought about Jesus asking for a drink from this very well, and then shifting the conversation to the promise of "living water".

It was humbling and deeply moving to stand at Jacob's Well, to drink the cool, sweet water, and to remember the promise of Jesus. "The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life" (John 4:14b). Thank you, Jesus, for the gift and promise of Living Water.

During this Year of Scripture, we will aspire to grow as Christian disciples through three distinct practices:

1) Bible Reading– see the chart to the right for April Readings

2) Bible Reflection to help us to become fluent in the language of sacred scripture. The artists at the Bible Project (available online) do a great job of bringing Scripture to life.
