

CANDLE LIGHTING

Today we celebrate God's gift of love and remember that we have been commanded to love others as God loves us. **C: Amen**

² But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days.

³Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall returnto the people of Israel. ⁴And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the LORD,

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.

Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

We praise you for these gifts of bread and wine.


Strengthen us with this food that we may live in expectation for the advent of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION



Welcome!



Indicate to the Pastor that you would like pre-sealed elements and skip the wine server. Those who wish to receive a blessing should indicate their wishes to the Pastor by crossing their arms over their chest.
