The non-Pauline epistles are the New Testament letters that were not written by the Apostle Paul. These letters are sometimes referred to as the "Catholic" or "Universal" Epistles, because they were not written to specific churches or individuals but rather to a wider audience. They include James, 1 Peter, 2 Peter, 1 John, 2 John, 3 John, Jude, and Hebrews. The book of Hebrews was our Faith Practice reading in 2024, so we will be focusing on the rest this time.

Here's a general overview:

**James:** Traditionally attributed to James, the brother of Jesus, though its authorship is debated. James argues that true faith is evidenced by good works, emphasizing that faith without action is dead or incomplete. The author calls believers to live out their faith authentically and practically, demonstrating their love for God and neighbor through obedience, wisdom, and compassionate action.

1 Peter and 2 Peter: Both letters, attributed to Peter the Apostle, encourage believers to persevere in their faith and live faithfully in the face of persecution and false teachings. 1 Peter emphasizes hope and holy living amidst suffering, 2 Peter focuses on combating error and preparing for Christ's return.

**1 John, 2 John, and 3 John**: All three are attributed to John the Apostle. They provide instruction and encouragement for believers to live in fellowship with God, adhere to sound doctrine, love one another, and support the spread of the gospel, while also warning against the dangers of false teachings and divisive behavior.

**Jude:** Attributed to Jude the brother of James. Jude writes to equip believers to recognize and resist false teachers, remain steadfast in their faith, and live out their calling as followers of Christ while awaiting his return.

These non-Pauline letters offer different perspectives on Christian life and theology compared to the Pauline epistles. They address various issues and concerns within the early church, providing valuable insights into the development of early Christian thought.

# Northwestern Ohio Synod

Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

Bishop Daniel G. Beaudoin







The Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected as the next presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Ariz., on July 30, 2025.

He will begin this role on Oct. 1, 2025, and be installed on Oct. 4 in Minneapolis.

Currently, he serves as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod, where he leads a synod staff and 160 congregations by providing pastoral care, preaching, teaching, administering sacraments, and overseeing ordinations and installations. He was elected synod bishop in 2019 and reelected in spring 2025. Curry chaired the ELCA Conference of Bishops, fostering ecumenical relationships and theological engagement across the Lutheran communion.

Previously, Curry served as the mission developer (2007–2012) and pastor (2013–2019) of Shekinah Chapel Lutheran Church in Riverdale, III. He earned a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, III., and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. He and his wife, LaShonda, are the proud parents of three daughters.

#### WHAT IS LMM?

LMM is Lutheran Men in Mission; one of the last remaining national ministries to men whose primary focus and mission is discipleship and evangelism. Our goal is to intentionally disciple men to become bold, daring followers of Jesus Christ.

- · Only 26% of men attend church in any given year, and that % decreases for men under the age of 40.
- · 65% of men in the United Stated self-identify as being lonely.
- · Only 10% of men report that they participate in any sort of mens groups or ministry.
- · 90 million men are not involved in any form of Christian discipleship.

Considering there are 113 million men in the US, the need for ministries like LMM has never been greater!

Fortunately, LMM is stepping up to meet this challenge! Over the last few year, our impact includes:

- · Over 89,000 men reached.
- · 1,100 individuals and counting have participated in a Bold Gathering.
- · More than 2,500 men have been transformed by the OYTL 44-hours experience.
- · 15,000+ have taken advantage of Project Twelve.
- · Over 68,000 Master Builder Bibles have been distributed or purchased.

Our work is far from over, but we take seriously the call of Christ in Matthew 28:19 when He said; "Go and make disciples of all nations…"

# FROM THE PRESIDING BISHOP OF THE ELCA THE REV. ELIZABETH EATON ENDING AT THE BEGINNING

I started my ministry as presiding bishop with these four emphases:

We are church. We are Lutheran. We are church together. We are church for the sake of the world. I will end as I began.

**We are church.** There is no other institution on earth whose reason for being is the proclamation of the gospel. "It is also taught that at all times there must be and remain one holy, Christian church. It is the assembly of all believers among whom the gospel

is purely preached and the holy sacraments are administered according to the gospel" (Augsburg Confession, Article VII). That's it. The works we do in service to the world are important, but they are not the essence of the church. The <u>ELCA</u> does not exist in order to work for justice. Rather, because we are nourished by word and sacraments, the ELCA is free and empowered to do so.

The church is also marvelously intricate and interconnected. "We, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another" (Romans 12:5). There is no such thing as a solitary Christian. God's love for us through Christ and poured into our hearts by the Spirit is for each of us. But each of us is just one member of the body of Christ. We understand the church in the same way. "This church shall seek to function as people of God through congregations, synods, and the churchwide organization, all of which shall be interdependent. Each part, while fully the church, recognizes that it is not the whole church and therefore lives in an interdependent relationship with the others" (ELCA "Constitutions, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions" 8.11.).

#### Be assured that the season for the ELCA is not over. God hasn't finished with this church yet.

We are Lutheran. The average Lutheran in the <u>Lutheran World Federation</u> (LWF) is a woman in Tanzania. There are more Lutherans in Ethiopia, Indonesia and Madagascar than there are in the ELCA. The LWF has 150 member churches in 99 countries. What binds us together? Certainly not one culture or cuisine. Rather, it is the clear witness of the gospel that sets us free. "It is taught that we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin and righteousness before God through our merit, work, or satisfactions, but that we receive forgiveness of sin and become righteous before God out of grace for Christ's sake through faith ...." (Augsburg Confession, Article IV).

This is revolutionary. The standards of the world by which we are measured, or we measure others, are a figment. We don't claim perfection for the church. We're not there. But as Martin Luther said, "This life therefore is not righteousness but growth in righteousness, not health but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it, the process is not yet finished, but it is going on, this is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory, but all is being purified" ("Defense and Explanation of All the Articles"). We know there is law and gospel, that we are saint and sinner, that we are bound and free, and we entrust that all to God.

We are church together. Paul wrote that we do not live to ourselves. We live in a time when fear is used to separate us. This is the tool of every authoritarian regime. The church is different. The Spirit calls, gathers and keeps the whole church on earth. We belong to God, we belong to each other, and we belong to the world.

We are church for the sake of the world. We are not only freed from sin, we are freed for service to the neighbor. Here is where the essence of the church—the proclamation of the gospel—gives power and shape to the work we do in Jesus' name. We are church for the sake of the world not out of obligation or for reward but out of love.

So there it is, dear church, my farewell address. We each have this ministry for a season. My season as presiding bishop has ended. Bishop-elect Yehiel Curry's season is about to begin. Pray for him, his family and the churchwide staff.

But be assured that the season for the ELCA is not over. God hasn't finished with this church yet.

Dan Kessler made a motion on behalf of the Courtyard Committee for council approval to spend \$16,800 to Jeff Moritz for the Courtyard renovations. Cheryl Beger 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Motion passed.

Christian Community Life: Thank you to the Evangelism Committee for their help serving refreshments to the Calvary visitors. Lunch was not served for the God's Work, Our Handsnot enough people. We plan to do the same food at Trunk or Treat: hot dogs, water, chips, popcorn & cookies. CCL would like to start the collection of PJ's for the Holiday Bureau again this year. Collections will be in October & November. Watch for the sizes to be posted at the entrance outside the office door. Genoa Food Pantry Updates for July: Served 31 families with 68 patrons. July donations were \$220.00, Expenses-\$1,371.76 + \$1,776.32. Genoa Food Pantry updates for August: Served 34 families with 71 patrons. August donations were \$1,100.00. Expenses- \$1,344.01 + \$2,317.40. Genoa Custom Interiors leveled the other side of the floor in freezer room at no charge. The last day for the sale of the Bauman Auto tickets will be October 11<sup>th</sup>.

We are serving at the Genoa Food Pantry on Saturday, October 18<sup>th</sup> with the pre-packing day on Thursday, October 16<sup>th</sup>.

We had discussion about updating the Church Rental Agreement for weddings, funerals, showers and other rented events held here at the church. We need to update the rental agreement as the new door code system has been installed. Communication will need to be provided between several groups and individuals such as the Property Committee, Musicians, the Office Manager, Pastor, Sound System people and other church council members if necessary.

The Property Committee will get the rental agreement from the church office and start the updates to bring back to council for approval.
