Ask the Congregation...

"Would you have any concerns with an electronic Annual Congregational Meeting?"

I'm turning the tables this month and asking a question of you...

Our Annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for January 24. Because of COVID we have to do some things different. We plan on having the meeting in the sanctuary following worship that day without our usual time of gathering and meal. However, using worship attendance to estimate the number of people comfortable returning to the sanctuary, it seems unlikely that we will be able to achieve a quorum for an in-person meeting in January, during a pandemic. Therefore, the Church Council is proposing that we allow people to connect through Zoom (which would be possible in the sanctuary). Zoom would fulfil the ELCA's recommendation to have a format that allows for two way communication; we want to make sure that everyone has the opportunity to be heard.

Unfortunately, our constitution does not have the provision for online meetings beyond the congregational council (the ECLA model constitution does, but ours was updated after that provision was added; we are missing C10.08 in our constitution). For this reason, we are seeking suspend this rule for our 2021 Annual Congregational Meeting. The Church Council thought since we are not voting on anything like spending thousands of dollars on a roof this year we could be flexible.

If you **DO** have concerns with this plan, please let me know (or notify Rick Buhrow or Diana Pfaff) by January 10. This could turn out to be a good way to include some of the folks who usually don't get to attend our Annual Meetings.



Corinth was a large, bustling city (located in southern Greece). Because of its location, goods and people from around the world flowed in and out of its ports. It was a center for art, philosophy and religion. It contained a number of pagan temples including large ones to Apollo and Aphrodite. The city had a reputation for vide, immorality and debauchery. Paul spent 18 months establishing a church in Corinth during his second missionary journey (described in Acts 18).


1 Corinthians (which may actually be the second letter Paul wrote to the Corinthians; the first was lost) was written around 54 AD. It was in response to reports Paul received concerning problems in the church, disputed matters, and competing factions. (The letter written *to* Paul has not survived.)

Overall, the letter calls this fractious congregation to unity, Paul reminds them their actions should be informed by love (chapters 8 and 13), and closes with an appeal to let this love be the governing power in the life of the community.

2 Corinthians is perhaps the most difficult to interpret of all Paul's letters. Scholars think it is a combination of several fragments of different letters. This makes it seem disjointed in places. It is certainly a mixed letter, containing different styles and various elements; appeals, exhortations, rebukes, threats, attacks, counterattacks, self-defense, self-praise, and irony.

Week of January 4

2 Corinthians 1

Praise be to the God of all comfort. Paul suffers and is consoled in Christ. Paul was delivered by God from desperate troubles and a sentence of death in Asia. Paul has acted not with fleshy wisdom, but in accordance with the grace of God.

Week of January 11

2 Corinthians 2

Paul did not want to come to the Corinthians in sorrow. Paul writes this letter rather than visiting personally. He recommends that the Corinthian Christians forgive the brother who had sinned (and repented) among them.

Week of January 18

2 Corinthians 3 Does Paul need a letter of recommendation? He has one; the Corinthian Christians themselves – they are an epistle written on his heart, not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God. Paul is not sufficient of himself, but is sufficient in Christ. The new covenant is not of the letter, but of the Spirit – for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

Week of January 25

2 Corinthians 4

Paul has not acted with craftiness or deceit. Our gospel is veiled to those who are perishing. We do not preach ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord, who has shone in our hearts. God's treasure is in earthen vessels. We have suffered, but are resilient, carrying around within us the dying of the Lord Jesus. God will raise us up, as he raised up the Lord Jesus.

Week of February 1

2 Corinthians 5

Our earthly house (ie physical bodies) may be destroyed, but we have a heavenly house made by God. We yearn to be clothed with our heavenly habitation, so mortality will be swallowed up by life. When we are at home in the body we are absent from the Lord. When we pass from these bodies to the world beyond, we must each give an account before the judgment seat of Christ according to what we have done, whether good or bad. We regard no one according to the flesh. Anyone in Christ is a new creation. We are reconciled to God in Christ. God made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.



ELCA Future Church design affirmed by ELCA Church

The Church Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has affirmed the proposed Future Church design that is focused on a renewed purpose to activate the entire church so that more people may know the way of Jesus and discover community, justice and love. The council, which serves as the ELCA's board of directors and legislative authority for the church between churchwide assemblies, held its electronic meeting Nov. 12-14.

Future Church is based in the belief that members, congregations, synods and the churchwide organization must work together to share the powerful witness of the gospel in the world and to invite more new, young and diverse people to experience God's grace in action. The new design identifies three priority areas: a welcoming church that engages new, young and diverse people; a thriving church rooted in tradition and radically relevant; and a connected, sustainable church that shares in a common purpose and direction.

The Future Church structure will be implemented in the churchwide organization on Feb. 1, 2021. The structure will introduce three new home areas: Christian Community and Leadership, led by the Rev. Philip Hirsch; Innovation, led by Ms. Mikka McCracken; and Service and Justice, led by the Rev. Rafael Malpica Padilla. Approximately 5% of the churchwide organization staff will be separated as a result of the new design.

For more than 30 years the ELCA has experienced a rich history of ministry, but the church has also witnessed a pattern of significant decline with aging members and a membership profile that does not reflect the diversity of God's creation.

ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth A. Eaton told the council that the COVID-19 pandemic had brought into sharper focus the need to respond more quickly to this rapidly changing world.

"Whether there had been a pandemic or not, we know we need to change. I think the pandemic helped us to see the urgency," Eaton said. "We are presenting this design because we believe that this is the way God will enable us to move more quickly, more faithfully, and reach more people so that more people may know the way of Jesus."

William B. Horne II, ELCA vice president and chair of the Church Council, said he believes the new design provides the opportunity to be church together, bringing about collaboration throughout the broader church.

In response to the continuing trends in membership and diversity and the data from an innovation readiness survey, the following new criteria were affirmed for the ELCA:

- 1. Prioritize the engagement of new, young and diverse people.
- 2. Unite all expressions of the church (congregations, synods and the churchwide organization) into one church—together.
- 3. Align decision-making, accountability and leadership where best suited.
- 4. Operate in agile, flexible and speedy ways.
- 5. Act based on data and measurable impact.
- 6. Eliminate silos and divisions.

Financial Report: Kent Deventhal reported that the Mission Fund rates came from the Bank wrong and was noticed by Al Brown. The bank corrected. Budgeted income was down for November. Year to date income compared to 2019 still shows a 1% increase. Expenses are down for the Boards as well as water, gas and electric due to lack of in-person worship and activities.

Fred Lammers presented the 2011 Budget Worksheet. The budget will be very similar to the 2020 budget. The total of the combined Board budget was reduced by approximately \$3000. The only other notable change was to provide a Tech salary under contract personnel.

This 2021 budget is due to this year's situation. The 2022 budget may be higher. Diana Pfaff reminded all that any board needing money for a project should just present their project. Diana Pfaff made the motion to accept the 2021 Budget recommend from the Finance Committee. Gary Johnson seconded the motion. Motion passed. Rick thanked the committee for completion of the budget.

<u>Christian Community Life</u>: Marcia Morgan read the report from Cheryl Berger:

Our church did an awesome job serving in November. We served 33 families and 73 total people at the Food Pantry. Bauman sells tickets at their dealership and that amount is divided amongst all of the organizations, our portion was \$155.67: we sold \$2985.00 and that totals \$3140.67 total to the pantry. Since 2013, the Genoa Food Pantry has received \$24,270.00 from selling car raffle tickets! Thank you to everyone!

Cindy Hartman has informed the Food Pantry board she is resigning on 12/31/2020. So, we do have an opening for that position. If anyone is interested!

Shopping for the Stars - We had a very nice selection of Christmas gifts for the Luther Home of Mercy Residents. Thanks for all your support and to Jane and Richard Phillips for making the stars and their delivery service.

Parish Education: Kim Sommers reported that the Parish Ed Christmas Party will be this Sunday! We will be ringing bells at the Millers Market on Tuesday December 22.

<u>Worship Life</u>: Deanna Neuman reported the Longest Night Service has been recorded. CD's and DVD's are available. Andy Kessler will put the service on line.

The Christmas Eve service is also recorded and is 82 ½ minutes long. It will be posted on Christmas Eve at 4:00pm and available on Facebook and You Tube. CD's and DVD's will be available. The first drive-thru communion had 35 participants.

Property: Gary Johnson reported the nativity display was set up. The mower deck removed and snow blade installed. The bad breakers for light by altar were replaced as LED bulbs outside social hall. John oiled and serviced the blowers in sanctuary. OLD BUSINESS: Nominating committee update: Diana Pfaff reported the committee has completed the full 2021 nominations for Church officers and Board Members. The committee enjoyed talking to all the members and "catching up" with people not seen in a while. Rick thanked the committee for all their hard in completing the ballot for 2021. Diana reported the installation of officers will be installed the weekend of December 30/31.

Annual Meeting: Our Annual Meeting is scheduled for January 24, 2021. It was proposed we have the meeting in the sanctuary following worship at 10:45am without our usual food or meal. However, it is unlikely that we will be able to achieve a quorum for an in-person meeting in January. It was proposed that we allow people to connect through Zoom which would be possible in the sanctuary. We would need someone to act as host and take virtual attendance. And zoom would fulfill the ELCA's recommendation to have a format that allows for two-way communication. However, our constitution does not have the provision for online meetings beyond the congregational council(we are missing C10.08 in our constitution. C10.08 reads This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. The extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically. It was the decision of the Council to share this information with the congregation (email and newsletter) and ask if anyone has a problem with a combined in-person and zoom Annual Meeting. There should not be anything that requires a written ballot vote this year. There will be a budget vote and a nomination vote. This may turn out to be a good way to include some of the folks who usually don't get to attend our Annual Meetings. If someone does have a problem with this plan, please let Pastor, Rick Buhrow or the church office know by January 10th.

Attendance would be taken on Zoom, comments and voting would be through "chat" and the session would be recorded. Pauses by the host would need to be longer to accommodate the attendees.
