Ask the Pastor

"Sometimes I struggle with doubt? Does that make me a bad Christian?"

The short answer is no; struggling with doubt does not make you a bad Christian. Faith is hard work and struggle part of the journey.

The week after Easter our Gospel reading is always the story of Thomas' encounter with Jesus after he said, "if I can't see the nail holes in his hands, I won't believe." (John 20:24) Unfortunately that statement earned him the name "Doubting Thomas". And because of that we get the impression that we are not allowed to ask the hard questions without being labeled a cynic or a skeptic.

But... since when are questions bad? Since when is it wrong to admit that we don't understand everything? Since when is it wrong to ask God to clarify something? Read the account of Job or the Psalms. Both are filled with uncertainties, complaints, and questions of God.

Contrary to popular belief, faith is not the absence of doubt. And faith does not mean you have all the answers; that's called certainty. Faith is when we are willing to embrace the doubts, ask the questions, and face the answers. Faith is continuing to trust, even when we are *uncertain*. Faith is believing in something that is beyond our ability to comprehend, but not being afraid to try.

Faith can't be reduced to a set of rules, where everything fits, where everything makes sense, where all we have to do is to connect the dots. That's the kind of thing the Pharisees tried to do. They tried to explain everything in a formula; to make all of life so that it could be answered by a set of rules. And if it didn't fit within that set of rules they rejected it as heresy or blasphemy. And consequently, their hearts were closed to the renewing of Christ simply because he didn't meet the criteria.

Unfortunately, we Christians can sometimes do the same thing... We have perhaps an unspoken need for our thinking about God to be right in order to have a joyful, freeing, healing, and meaningful faith. And anything doesn't fit into the determined rules is rejected. For many, thinking about God doesn't leave room for doubt. Many think "knowing" makes them a good Christian.

But when we are confronted with something new, or the possibility of being wrong, or situations that make us say with the psalmist, "Lord, just where is this steadfast love you swore to your people?" (Psalm 89:49)... the "certain of the facts kind of faith" falls apart. It tries to make the messiness fit inside the box it created or push it away and call it faithlessness... When that happens, we are not actually trusting God at that moment. We are trusting ourselves and disguising it as trust in God. Faithfulness that doesn't leave room for doubt isn't really faith...

So maybe Thomas' story isn't so much about doubt as it is a story about how it's okay to ask questions... how it's okay to be unsure... how it's faithful, even Biblical, to express doubts, anger, and disappointment in God... Maybe Thomas' story is about how God comes to us in the midst of doubt, stands with us, and offers faith. Truth be told, we've all been a "doubting Thomas" at some point in our lives; and that's okay. Doubt is not the opposite of faith. And it is into our doubting and searching hearts where Jesus breaks in and reveals himself to us. God comes to us through the questions.



At St. John, we confirm the following young people have completed their classroom work, obtained service points, completed sermon notes and a successful exit interview and are recommended for Confirmation.


As a congregation, we hold these young persons in prayer and trust that God will continue to lead and guide them in all the aspects of their lives now and in the future.

Social Hall and Basement Rental Guidelines

Guidelines for Social Hall and Basement Rental have been updated and finalized as follows. Copies of this rental agreement can be

found in either kitchen (basement and/or social hall) or can be obtained from Amelia in the church office.

GUIDELINES FOR USE OF THE SOCIAL HALL AND/OR BASEMENT AT ST. JOHN LUTHERAN CHURCH

- 1. Cost of the room and janitor's time is \$50.00 for members (\$150 for non-members*). Please send this payment to the church office BEFORE the rental date. The reservation cannot be confirmed until payment is received.
- 1. **No alcoholic beverages** are to be consumed on church grounds.
- 2. **Smoking** is **not permitted** within the church building nor on the church grounds.
- 3. Each group is responsible for **cleaning** up after themselves. Leave the space as you found it. The custodian will dispose of trash. Please have it bagged and sitting near the trash cans in the hall. Please be sure to turn off all lights before you leave.
- 4. Those using the room should **provide** their own table service, paper products, etc. We ask that all tables be covered with plastic table cover (purchased at Gordon Food Service {GFS}). Hot dishes and large foil serving pans <u>MUST be set</u> on Formica mats which can be found in the southwest lower corner cabinet.
- 5. **No parking** of vehicles in front of parking lot entrance doors or in front of adjacent garage. Please use the parking lot so as not to block the garage. **Please** inform your guests so that cars do not have to be moved.
- 6. Please <u>do not</u> slide tables and chairs. Picking them up as they are moved prevents scratching of the floor's finish. Please remember to turn off all lights -- check the bathroom lights, etc.
- 7. **Reservations** to use the room may be made by contacting the church office. For members making the reservation, they MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE at the gathering. Reservation must be made by the party desiring to use the facility. Members are not allowed to make reservations for non-members.
- 1. Please supervise children and do not allow them to roam around the building or play on the elevator.
- 2. **NO** decorating with **GLITTER**, **CONFETTI** or anything that tends to spread or that sticks to surfaces.
- 3. **Rental times** on week days (Monday Friday) are 9:00 a.m. out by 8:00 p.m. On weekends hours of rental are limited to Saturday 9:00 a.m. out by 4:00 p.m., or start after 6:00 p.m. out by 8:00 p.m. Sunday events must start after 11:00 a.m. out by 8:00 p.m.

If you need the building to be opened for your event please notify the church office. For concerns during the event, you may contact Paul at 419-297-0217.


