Ask the Pastor

"IN earth or ON earth?"

During our devotion time at our Church Council meeting, we are reflecting on the Lord's Prayer. This past month we talked about the phrase, "your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven". Someone observed in Matthew 6:10, the King James Version reads, "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven." And the New Revised Standard Version reads, "Your kingdom come. Your will be done, **on** earth as it is in heaven." A question was asked about the difference between IN earth and ON earth.

I dug out my Greek-English Bible and discovered there are two different prepositions used here... "IN" heaven the word is $\dot{\epsilon}v$ and seems to have a single meaning of "in". "ON" earth uses the word $\dot{\epsilon}\pi\dot{\iota}$ has the basic meaning on, but also includes a wide range of meanings according to the context; over, on, at the time, on the basis of, etc. But as far as I can tell, it does not have the meaning of "in". So, the short answer to the question is, I have no idea why the KJV translated the phrase "in earth". Perhaps it is an early modern-age linguistic thing that I do not understand.

It's interesting that the 'traditional' version of the Lord's Prayer, which is based on the KJV, uses the phrase "on earth". Somebody somewhere must have decided that "on" was better phrasing.

"On Palm Sunday, did Jesus ride a donkey, a colt, or somehow both?"

When describing Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, the Gospel writers are quoting the prophet Zechariah (9:9), "Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." It seems Zechariah is using a form of Hebrew poetry called "synonymous parallelism". That's when a thought or idea is repeated in successive lines. We see that quite frequently in scripture. For example, Psalm 120:2, "Save me, O Lord, from lying lips and from deceitful tongues." "Lying lips" and "deceitful tongues" is a repetition of the same idea, just like "on a donkey" and "on a colt".

Mark (11:7), Luke (19:35), and John (12:14) each only mention one animal. Matthew, however, mentions both (Matthew 21:5). We can only guess why he did this. Matthew may not know what "synonymous parallelism" is, but that seems very unlikely to me. Some suggest "Jesus sat on them" (12:7), refers to the cloaks, not the two animals, but the Greek is not clear. My favorite suggestion is that Matthew is writing theologically more than literally. I.e. Matthew wants to be REALLY clear Jesus was fulfilling the prophet, Zechariah. Without a doubt, Jesus is the promised king riding into Jerusalem.

Danny Jeffers


1947-2023
