Ask the Pastor

"There are places in the Bible where it says to 'fear the Lord', but then it also says, 'do not be afraid'. How can we both fear the Lord and at the same time believe Jesus when tells us not to be afraid?

It may sound like a contradiction, but I believe we can do both. But to do that, we need to understand what it means to fear. In the dictionary, fear has several different definitions...

The first is "an unpleasant often strong emotion caused by anticipation or awareness of danger." This is fear as its most basic, animal level. This is the fear that directs the "fight or flight" response of the autonomic nervous system. Fear or excitement causes signals to travel to the hypothalamus, which triggers a rapid heartbeat, faster breathing, widening of the pupils, and increased blood flow. The second definition of fear is closely related to this; "anxious concern." Anxiety is an emotional state in which people feel uneasy, apprehensive, or fearful. People usually experience anxiety about events they cannot control or predict, or about events that seem threatening or dangerous.

Jesus is speaking to these types of fear, the emotional responses, the anxiety, when he says "Do not be afraid, little flock..." (Luke 12:32) The source of our security, is the phrase, "it's your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Because God loves us, God is pleased to give us the kingdom! We don't need to be paralyzed by the fear of judgement. The image here is not of a stingy, miserly God begrudgingly withholding love; rather it is an image of God who through our Lord Jesus Christ grants us a presence, a power, a peace in the midst of life's uncertainties.

This brings us to the final definition of fear; "profound reverence and awe." We are not supposed to have a flight or fight response or excess anxiety about God's judgement, but rather deep admiration and respect for what God has done for us.

God revealed to us in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus that tells us nothing could make God happier or give God more pleasure, than to rescue us from despair, heal us from brokenness, and bless us with the Spirit's presence. The Lord who returns in judgement is the same Lord who first laid down his life in love for us on the cross. It is truly God's great delight and pleasure to love us, to care for us, and to give us the kingdom.

We do not need to be afraid, but this is certainly worthy of profound reverence and awe.




2022 Golf Outing to benefit the Good Samaritans Fund



"LET'S CHAT" with a Stephen Minister

Do you remember the day when things closed down due to the Coronovirus? Do you remember where you were, what you were doing, who you were with when you heard the news? I don't remember exactly – like I do when I think about 9/11 – I remember where I was, what I was doing, and who I was with. I remember being at work and having other real life issues to address in those moments and hours after the news first broke. I, along with my coworkers at that time, tried to keep up with the news, but also be attentive to those real life issues that we needed to address. I don't really remember how my work day ended that day – or how, once I got home, discussed it with our children. That was a terrible day – one that some details of my response that day to the news have been wiped from my mind, but the day as a whole will never be forgotten and the people that were with me and I with them.

And I think that this pandemic will never be forgotten – at least not in our lifetime. Just like 9/11, or any devastating news, any medical tests or illness, any change to yesterday's "normal", any birth of a baby, any child that leaves the "nest", any challenges related to parenting, any job stress or job loss, any military deployment of a loved one or close friend, any rehabilitation from an illness, injury, or surgery, any financial stress, anyone experiencing loneliness, any adjustment to retirement, (I think by now you get the idea of the many possible "any's") - so may I repeat the beginning of the sentence – Just like 9/11 and the days that followed where we joined together – in prayers, in our phone calls, conversations, and in our worship together – let us now join together in these ways and more as we begin to live after this pandemic and strive to walk along with someone who is experiencing one of those "any's".

You can play an important role in our Stephen Ministry – you may know of a friend, neighbor, co-worker, or relative who is going through a time of one of life's challenges - an "any" time. We'd like to hear from you! Talk with one of our Stephen Leaders – Pastor O'Brien, Janice Sheahan, Traci Brown, or Audrey Milbrodt about any suggestions and ideas you have to reach out to others who need that focused care, encouragement, and support of a Stephen Minister.
