If you would like to submit a question for "Ask the Pastor", Biblical, theological, church related, anything you have been dying to ask a pastor, you can hand me a note, ask me after church, send an e-mail, or sneak into the church after dark and anonymously slide a sealed envelope under my office door. If I answer your question in print, I will not include your name unless you explicitly ask me to.

Ask the Pastor

Why Preparing for a sermon a week or so ago on the lesson of sorting the sheep and goats I came across the question, "What is Jesus teaching and inviting his disciples to think and do?"

At its heart, this story is about incarnation. (That's the 'churchy' word for God taking on flesh.) We usually hear that word at Christmas; God becoming flesh in the baby Jesus. Jesus is God incarnate; but it goes deeper than that... God has also taken up residence in each one of us as well. With this sheep and goats lesson, Jesus was teaching his disciples that if we want to find him, we look to others. Especially the "least of these" ...

We normally expect to see Jesus in holy places; on mountaintops, in sunsets, in a church/cathedral during worship, in the bread and wine during Holy Communion, or in the Bible when we read our devotional. And Jesus certainly is in all those places... but they may not be his primary residence. Jesus says in Matthew's Gospel... "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." (Matthew 25:35-36)

Where do we find Jesus? Jesus is living on the streets... Jesus is in soup kitchen lines and food pantries... Jesus is waiting at the Salvation Army to get a coat... Jesus is in a holding cell at the border... Jesus is in a refugee camp... Jesus is in the hospital, or more likely, suffering outside, because he can't afford to go to the hospital... Jesus is in prison...

There's no way we can misread what Jesus said in this Gospel account; "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me." In other words, wherever people are in need, wherever people suffer, wherever people do without their basic needs, Jesus is there. And Jesus is not just there to comfort those who suffer. He is suffering right along with them. That's where Jesus is...With this business of sorting sheep and goats (Matthew 25:31-46), Jesus is telling us that he is out in the world right now, waiting - not for a church service to start, but for human contact. For caring. For compassion. For love. The kind of love our Lord meant when he told us to love God and love our neighbors.

We discover that we are doing God's work; we are doing Kingdom work, when we learn to see Jesus is all these people and respond with compassion and love.

Change in Christmas Eve Schedule

This year we are combining the "Candlelight" worship service with the choir service to one time of worship at 7:00pm.

With attendance numbers decreasing and fluctuating over the years, the Worship Life Committee has discussed on a yearly basis how many Christmas Eve worship services we need to accommodate worshipers yet still be a good use of time and resources of our worship leaders and volunteers. This year, with Christmas Eve falling on Sunday, Worship Life proposed, and the Church Council agreed, we experiment with a change. We will still have three worship services on Christmas Eve, but the schedule will be different...

This year, on December $24^{\rm th}$, we will celebrate the Fourth week in Advent at 9:45am (and 5:00p on 12/23). We will celebrate Christmas Eve at 4:00pm and 7:00pm.

Change can be hard, but it's important to not be afraid to try different things. We will seek a way for the congregation to provide feedback and evaluate our experiment after the first of the year. Thank you for your patience and your willingness to adapt and adjust with us.




Jesus, Gentle Shepherd This cane of red and white Proclaims the sweet love story, Born on Christmas night.

And so this cane reminds us Of just how much You care, And like Your Christmas gift to us, It's meant for all to share.





Gracious Lord,







Pastor's Report:

Worship Attendance: In person average for Oct 2023 -106.6 compared to Oct 2022 - 110. Online average for Oct 2023 - 68.4 compared to Oct 2022 - 85. Numbers: 20 hospital/homebound visit/individual or family meetings. 3 committee/group meetings. 5 community/youth/fellowship events. 7 professional/clergy activities. 1 funeral (Merle Moritz on October 10th.). Day Care Update: On November 1, Mike Muslof, Fire Chief, walked through the building. He had some minor suggestions but saw no major issues. We are still waiting on a meeting with an architect who assists with setting up day care sites so she can see the space and give recommendations. Thanksgiving Worship: Sunday, November 19th at 5:00p followed by a community meal at 6:00p. Advent Study: We will be reading "The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem" by Adam Hamilton. The book is \$17.99 on Amazon, \$13.49 on Kindle. There will be TWO different opportunities to gather (the same material will be covered at both). Monday mornings at 10:00a (11/27, 12/4, 12/11, and 12/18) and Tuesday evening at 7:00p (11/28, 12/5, 12/12, and 12/19). If this is something you would be interested in participating in please let me know.

Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Finance Committee Report: Dan Kessler, Jennifer Nelson & Kristina Wildman (report included in packet)

Expenses: We are 93% of the monthly budget and 96% of the year to date budget. Income: We are 105% of our monthly budget and 93% of our year to date budget. Income over expenses: On a year to date basis, we are currently negative \$14,829 compared to our budget of negative \$7,672. Budget for this year was 292,000 this year. Next year they are preliminary recommending a budget of 293,500 for next year. Thanksgiving offering: Pastor O'Brien motioned to designate the Thanksgiving offering to the Jerusalem Food Pantry, motioned seconded by Cheryl Berger, motioned passed. Christmas offering: Jenifer Nelson motioned to designate the Christmas offering to be split between Lutheran Home of Mercy: Special Projects (The Cottages), and the Elliston Food Pantry, motion seconded by Dan Kessler, motion passed.

Christian Community Life: Cheryl Berger

We had a great day for Trunk or Treat. There were alot of decorated cars! We served 100 hot dogs, along with popcorn, snacks and water. Our committee discussed plans for decorating & serving for the Advent tea. Reminder to have your gifts for Shopping with the Stars by Dec 3rd. Food pantry minutes: Patrons: 83 - Families: 38 (includes 3 new families) -

Donations: \$2390.00 - Expenses: \$4111.23
