Ask the Pastor

"It seems like the problems of the world are so great. I want to help, but how do I know if I'm making a difference?" I love the quote by Mother Teresa, "Never worry about numbers. Help one person at a time and always start with the person nearest you."

And a related quote from Helen Barry, "Helping one person might not change the whole world, but it could change the world for one person"

A couple of quotes probably don't answer your question, but it does reveal a greater truth. We shouldn't let the immensity of the world's problems paralyze our compassion. We can't help everybody, but we can all help somebody.

A several months ago we read Peter's confession (John 6)... the crowd was abandoning Jesus because his teaching were too hard. Jesus asked his core group of disciples, "do you want to leave too?" Peter replied, "Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life." With his "Yes!" to Jesus, the rest of the apostles echoed his "Yes!" I like to imagine that Peter's words held the group together at that crucial moment. He said just the right thing at just the right time. Peter pushed them in the right direction...

I like to imagine it played out that way because it holds an important lesson... I'm a rather ordinary person and I'm guessing you are too. I'm not disparaging your (or my worth); what I mean is, not many of us will find our way into history books. Not many of us will leave a legacy that will be remembered outside our family and friends. Because we are ordinary people, we might think we don't have much influence. We don't think our voice counts for much.

Peter shows us that's not necessarily true. He shows us how a few words, spoken from heartfelt conviction at the right time, can make a tremendous difference. He shows us how a person of faith can strengthen the faith of others. He shows us that one person can change lives.

Following Jesus can be uncomfortable sometimes... loving one another is hard work... eating of his flesh, perhaps we've sanitized that... but deeply partaking of Jesus so that he becomes part of who we are, and we become more like him... that can be challenging... sometimes it makes us want to go home... We want Jesus to comfort us when we are afflicted, and sometimes he does... But he also afflicts us when we are comfortable, and that's not always fun... But Jesus calls us to be faithful to him in the face of the world's opposition. Peter's "yes" shows us that we too can make a difference. We too can help people to know God's love and find new life. Our powerful "yes" can make all the difference for us and for someone else. As Christians, we have a calling to love, support, and care for one another. Maybe we won't change the world, but we all have the power to change at least one person's life — with a kind word, with a listening ear, with a prayer, by modeling faith, or simply by standing with someone through a difficult time, we can change a life.

And perhaps that love, care, and support that makes one person's life just a little bit better is where the Kingdom of God is found.

Below is a brief summary of the scholarships available. The scholarship committee recommends that anyone that has graduated high school within the last five years take a close look at the application requirements. All eligible students are encouraged to apply.

CURRENLTY AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS Tank Scholarship Fund

This scholarship fund was established in 1997 by a gift to St. John This scholarship is funded by an annual gift from Marlin and Linda Evangelical Lutheran Church, Williston, Ohio by the late Carol L. Tank and Robert M. Tank.

Phyllis Parks Endowed Scholarship Fund

The Phyllis Parks Scholarship Fund was established in August 2016 from the estate of Martin Parks bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

The scholarship principal and interest distributions of the funds shall be made annually over twenty (20) years with approximately one twentieth (1/20) distributed each year. The maximum individual Applicant must be a member of St. John Lutheran Church. scholarship will be \$1,000. The applicant must be a confirmed St. The scholarship will be available to all students meeting the John member and active in the life of the church.

Earl Johnson Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Earl Johnson Scholarship Fund was established in January 2016 from a portion of Earl's estate bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church during their high school years.

Scholarship value will be up to \$1,000 and determined by the applicant's church worship attendance as well as church and community activities.

While the applicant's GPA will be requested and is important, the activities noted above will carry more emphasis in the decision

The applicant must attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.

The applicant must be a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the school year's start date. Recipients can apply more than once but can only receive the scholarship once.

Younker Scholarship Fund

Younker. Awards are contingent upon receiving these funds.

The applicant will be a confirmed St. John member who is actively

Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but help and support him in every physical need" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.



Devotion for February

February

Opening Activity

Identify together areas in your life where people gather to listen to each other. For example, the breakfast diner, the coffee shop, the kitchen or dinner table, etc. Where do you spend time in deep listening to others? Next, as a council, talk about what listening spaces exist in your life together in community. How might you listen more deeply in those moments? Are there other listening spaces you might adopt?

Memory Verse

Isaiah 55:3a "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live."

Scripture Verse

James 1:19 "You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger.'

Reflection

I remember when my youngest child began to learn to drive. The state law had changed and as it is now, teens had to clock in 50 hours of driving with the parent. 50 hours? I panicked. I remember thinking, "what a burden this would be. I would never have time for all this. I was working full time; how would I ever get this done?"

Those 50 hours of being in the car with Brian turned out to be wonderful moments of sharing. They were unexpected gifts of time of listening and enjoying each other. He learned to drive; I learned to listen. We shared as we never had before. The time together created opportunities to pay attention and to hear one another. Amazing holy ground even inside of an automobile.
