Ask the Pastor

"Are we going to do the Reverse Advent Calendar collection again this year?

Short answer; YES!

For those who aren't familiar... The idea of the "Advent Calendar" dates back to the German Lutherans in the 1800s. It is based on the tradition of writing chalk tally marks on walls or lighting candles to count the remaining days until Christmas. Modern Advent calendars help you count down the days by either moving a little star on a calendar or opening up a little pocket or box to reveal a tiny gift. Since they were very little, we have gotten chocolate Advent calendars for our kids. Each day they can open the numbered window and count down the days until Christmas with a piece of chocolate.

The Reverse Advent Calendar puts a twist on this idea... Instead of taking something out for yourself, the idea is to put something in or set something aside to give to someone else – thus giving instead of getting. There are boxes and calendars listing different items for each day until Christmas available at the church. Or you can print a calendar from the newsletter or Facebook and use your own box from home. At the end of Advent, the reverse calendar will result in a collection of 24 items that can be dropped off at the church to support a good cause at Christmas time.

The calendar we have created supports the needs pantry at the Advent Center and the LIGHT Neighborhood Pantry at Elliston Zion UMC.

The Advent Lutheran Center is one of five day programs operated by Luther Home of Mercy. Here, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities socialize with others, interact with the community and learn new skills. When this site opened several years ago, there was a strong desire by participants to give back to their community through volunteering. However, they discovered many places are not willing or able to accommodate persons with disabilities as volunteers and the offer to help was frequently declined. That did not deter the Advent participants... instead, they opened their own personal needs pantry. (They believe this to be a first-of-its-kind program in Ohio and a true celebration of the positive community spirit of those they serve.) This project is largely funded by the individuals themselves, their families, and the staff who work there. They are not always able to keep up with the community demand for products. Our help enables the participants to keep the pantry open and keep offering smiles and needed items to others.


The LIGHT Neighborhood Pantry at Elliston Zion UMC is open to all residents of Ottawa County struggling with food insecurity. They are a local free choice food pantry where visitors can select the items they want and will use. The pantry can get many food items from the Toledo-NW Ohio Food Bank, but hygiene and personal need items are rarely available. Our help enables them to provide these items for the people they serve.

Our Reverse Advent Calendars will support both organizations when they are filled.

You will hear more about these ministries in the season of Advent.




Advent Book Study

This December, I'm going to be reading the book *A Child Is Born: A Beginner's Guide to Nativity Stories* by Amy-Jill Levine, and I'd love for you to join me.

From the publisher:

"In A Child Is Born, beloved New Testament scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the familiar nativity stories found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke—stories cherished by Christians worldwide yet often read through layers of



tradition and assumption. Levine helps us hear them anew, uncovering what the biblical authors were truly saying about Jesus' birth, about God's work in the world, and about what it means to respond with faith, courage, and joy."

Levine invites readers to look deeper at the Christmas stories we think we know so well—the shepherds and angels, the magi and the star, the manger and the mother—and to rediscover their meaning for our lives today. Her insights help us appreciate not only the beauty of the narratives but also the message of hope and inclusion they offer.

It may also be available through your local library or bookstore.

This is open to anyone with a Facebook account—no matter your location or mobility. I'll post questions and reflections on a couple of chapters at a time throughout Advent to guide our conversation.

I'm also open to organizing an **in-person discussion group**, similar to what we did last year for *Advent Conspiracy*. We could meet once to discuss the entire book or meet weekly through Advent. We could gather in the church, at a local café, or even someone's home - whatever works best for those interested.

Take a look at the book, maybe read the first chapter, and let me know what kind of gathering you'd enjoy. However you choose to participate (or not), I hope you'll consider reading the book this Advent season. It's a meaningful way to slow down, revisit the nativity stories with fresh eyes, and rediscover the wonder of Christmas.

What's the Beauty of Stewardship??

Stewardship has to do with how we manage our time, talent, resources — basically our entire lives. It's a beautiful concept when properly understood. Here are the basics of good stewardship:

God is the source of all creation, including our lives. God is the primary owner of all that exists.

We are blessed by being given the task of managing well all that we have influence over: our lives, our abilities, our minds and bodies, our time, our part of the earth, our finances, our children, our church buildings, our automobiles, etc.

Although we can make decisions regarding each of the above, ultimately we are responsible to God. Sooner or later, we must give an account of our management of God's creation and of God's gifts.

When we properly use the talents, resources and property that God allows us to manage, we find great joy. Think of planting a garden which soon overflows with colorful flowers, wonderful vegetables and flavorful herbs, etc. God gave us the plot of ground, God gave us the seed, God gave us the wisdom and strength to bring forth such beauty, such good things to see or eat, or smell. Yet we did the work, with God's help, to make it a reality. Like Adam we tilled it and kept it. But God gave the increase. God's provisions and our labor brought the garden to its fulfillment.

Good stewardship enables us to do something positive and wonderful with the money God has allowed us to have. What feels better than knowing one has managed money well? Our bank account, our checkbook and our portfolio tell the story. When money is handled well, we have enough for ourselves and are still able to give to God's work.



It's easy to list the blessings in life: good health, family, a satisfying career, a comfortable home. We might even be thankful for things others take for granted such as freedom and clean drinking water, reliable transportation and food enough to eat. Then there are the little things, such as gardens, sunrises, pets and coffee.

But what about life's storms or unanswered prayers? Should we be thankful for these? Loss and hardship remind us of our dependence on God. He uses trials to draw us closer to him, to show us that He is our rock and refuge. In misfortune and grief, we discover God's comfort and strength. Should we not, then, be thankful for the storms, too?

Gratitude Shift

When we look at what we want, and then compare that with what we have, we shall be unhappy.

When we think about what we really deserve, and then compare that with what we actually have, we shall thank God.



Northwestern Ohio Border Immersion by Border Servant Corps, November 5-9, 2025 Las Cruces, New Mexico | El Paso, Texas | Juarez, Mexico

During this Year of Listening, the Northwestern Ohio Synod is partnering with Border Servant Corps (BSC) to journey to the borderlands to learn about the current reality of immigration through a faith lens. Raiden & Jordan Browning (Olivet-Sylvania), Andrew Wells and Pastor Chris Hanley (Glenwood-Toledo), Pastor Shawn & Megan O'Brien and Connor Kacenjar (St. John-Williston), Bishop Daniel Beaudoin, Pastor Sarah Schaaf and Calla Gilson (NWOS Synod Staff) will journey together to explore the infrastructure, legal systems and on-the-ground work that impact immigration at the US southern border. The team will also have the opportunity to visit BSC partner shelters on the Mexican side of the border who are responding to the current immigration situation in faithful ways.

Respetrans opened as as shelter during the "Remain in Mexico" (Migrant Protection Protocol) era just before the Covid pandemic. Since that time, the shelter has expanded to house migrant families and is providing a temporary home for folks whose CBP One appointments were canceled by the Trump Administration and are in limbo without established residency in Mexico. BSC supports the work of this shelter with donations of food, medical supplies, children's items, and the installation of electricity in their building.

Cathedral is providing services that more closely resemble the "long welcome" of refugee resettlement, including food distributions and legal aid assistance to migrant families who have found work and housing in Juarez. These families have established residency in Mexico and are seeking asylum in Mexico since access to the United States is not currently an option for them. Border Servant Corps is a newer partner with this shelter and provides regular food donations and volunteer support.

As you bless the participants from your parish on their way, we would ask that members of your congregation consider the following ways to support:



Pray for this journey, each participant and all of the people and places we will learn from during this time.

Give to support the meaningful work of these shelters.

Be Open to the stories that will be brought home by participants, introducing opportunities to learn and act.
