## UPDATE to last month's follow-up question, "Are you going to have a slide show or make a presentation about your trip to the Holy Land?"

Yes! It was an incredible experience, and I would love to tell people about my trip. Some of you saw some pictures on Facebook, but there are a few thousand more. Literally... 3,715 pictures to be exact... and Good Shepherd Travel recently sent me more!

On March 25th, following Saturday worship I will be sharing a very small percentage of my pictures and talking about our trip to the Holy Land. After worship (around 5:45ish) we will gather in the basement for food and fellow-ship. We have arranged for the Sidon Lebanese Grill to cater. (It's not exactly the same, but it's very similar to the food we ate in Israel.) The menu will include Shish Tawook, Shish Kafta, Yellow Rice, Garden Salad, Hommus, Garlic Sause, and Baklava. The meal is **\$15 per person** and must be ordered and paid for in advance. See me to reserve a meal. (The **deadline** to order a meal is **March 19**.) If you don't like Middle eastern food, you are welcome to bring your own dinner and enjoy fellowship over a shared meal.

After we are done eating, probably about 6:30ish, we will view pictures, Shane and I will talk about our trip, and I will answer any questions you have about traveling to the Holy Land.

Please feel free to attend any or all these events as your interest or schedule allows. I.e., you don't have to eat food to see pictures and vice versa. If you want to eat baklava and leave, that's okay. If you want to show up at 6:30 for the pictures, that's okay too. I'm excited to talk about the trip with anyone who will listen.

If you have any questions, please let me know.


\*If Ottawa County is under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, we will <u>not</u> have worship or any other church related activities until the emergency has been cancelled.


## THE STORY OF JESUS

## SCHOLARSHIPS Available

Scholarships for continuing education are available from St. John Lutheran Church. Applications may be picked up from • the church office and are also available on the church's website. **The application deadline for all scholarships is March 31st, 2023.** You may return the completed forms to the church office any time before that date. **If you have any questions,** • **please contact a member of the scholarship committee: Pastor O'Brien, Deanna Neuman, and Al Brown.** 

Below is a brief summary of the scholarships available. The scholarship committee recommends that anyone that has graduated high school within the last five years take a close • look at the application requirements. All eligible students are encouraged to apply.

### TANK SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship was established in 1997 and is provided through the generosity of Carol Tank and the late Robert Tank.
- In order to be eligible for this scholarship, the applicant must be an active voting member of St. John Lutheran Church for at least three years before the start of the col lege semester that the applicant is applying for this scholarship.
- The applicant must attend a four year accredited college or university.
- The scholarship is a one year scholarship for \$500 that can be applied for by the applicant for their first or second year.
- A second scholarship is available for those attending Capi tal University.

### ST. JOHN SCHOLARSHIP (Lutheran Partners)

- The purpose of this scholarship fund is to aid in the education of our students who will be attending an ELCA related college.
- The applicant must be a voting member of St. John Lutheran Church.
- The grant will be \$500 for each qualified student contingent upon the dollars available in the scholarship fund.

#### YOUNKER SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship began in 2006 and is made available by an annual contribution from the Younker Scholarship Fund and is solely dependent on that annual contribution for the scholarship program to continue.
- The student must be a confirmed church member who is actively involved in the life of the Church and who demonstrates their faith.
- Recipient will be a recent high school graduate. Recent defined as within five years of the date of the beginning of the school year.
- The student will attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.

#### EARL JOHNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- This scholarship was established in January 2016 from a portion of Earl's estate bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.
- The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church during their high school years.
- Scholarship value will be up to \$1,000 and determined by the applicant's church worship attendance as well as church and community activities.
- The applicant must attend either a public or private accredited college or university and be degree seeking.
- Applicants must me a recent high school graduate. Recent shall be defined as within five years of the date of the beginning of the school year.
- Recipients can apply more than once, but can only receive the scholarship once.
- Scholarship recipient and value will be determined by the St. John scholarship committee.

#### PHYLLIS PARKS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Phyllis Parks Scholarship Fund was established in August, 2016 from the estate of Martin Parks bequeathed to St. John Lutheran Church.

- The maximum individual scholarship will be \$1,000.
- The applicant must be a confirmed St. John member and active in the life of the church.
- Special preference will be given to the applicant's church worship attendance.

### Dear Friends in Christ,

In Matthew chapter 4, Jesus is on the way. From his temptation in the wilderness (4:1-11); from Nazareth to Capernaum (4:13-17); to his time along the Sea of Galilee (4:18), Jesus is on the move. But then Jesus stops, heads up a mountain, sits down, and shares the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:1-7:28).

For those of us who are participating in <u>2023 Year of Story Daily Bible Reading Guide</u>, we will be spending the next five weeks reading through both the Sermon on the Mount and the Sermon on the Plain (Luke 6:17-49). Jesus will be our guide and companion for this sacred journey.

This Wednesday, February 22, we begin the Lenten journey with Ash Wednesday. In the Ash Wednesday Liturgy, the presiding minister extends an Invitation to Lent. 


## Lent Prayer with Gestures
