ASK THE PASTOR

"What are your New Year's resolutions going to be?"

Did you know that the earliest recorded "New Year's" celebration actually happened when there was no such thing as a calendar year? In early Babylon, the new year was celebrated in late March, the time between the sowing of seeds and the harvesting of crops. It was an eleven-day festival of food and wine, drama and dancing, culminating in a huge parade.

Through a series of Roman Emperors trying to make sense of the calendar (or make a name for themselves), "New Year" was eventually moved to January 1. After Rome converted to Christianity in the fourth century, the Church set out to abolish all pagan practices and condemned the celebration, forbidding Christians to participate. During the Middle Ages, the Church remained so strongly hostile to the old pagan New Year celebrations that in predominantly Catholic cities and countries the observance vanished altogether. When New Year was celebrated, it could fall practically anywhere... March 15th, December 15th, Christmas Day, or Easter Sunday. It is only within the past four or five hundred years that January 1st has enjoyed widespread acceptance.

I guess that was the long way of getting to the point... Four thousand years ago, the ancient Babylonians made resolutions as part of their New Year's celebrations. While our modern promises might include exercising more, eating better, etc. The Babylonians had their own two favorites: to pay off outstanding debts and to return all borrowed farming tools and household utensils.

Whatever traditions you follow in your New Year's celebration, and whatever promises or resolutions you may make, I would like you to consider adding one more... Resolve to spend a few more minutes each day reading the Bible. The Synod Office has published a Daily Bible Reading Guide for 2023 entitled, "The Story of Jesus". It is designed to lead us through the life and ministry of Jesus. Most of the readings are of reasonable length (multiple verses instead of multiple chapters) so it should be easy to stay on track even if you miss a day. I will have copies of the reading guide available at the church, and I will share the document electronically when it becomes available. If you want to get a head start, the first week looks like this...

I tried to think of a clever new phrase— A slogan to inspire the next 365 days, A motto to live by this coming New Year,





Dear Friends in Christ,

"Sing and rejoice, O daughter Zion! For I will come and dwell in your midst, says the Lord. Many nations shall join themselves to the Lord on that day and shall be my people, and I will dwell in your midst. And you shall know that the Lord of hosts has sent me to you. The Lord will inherit Judah as his portion in the holy land and will again choose Jerusalem. Be silent, all flesh, before the Lord, for he has roused himself from his holy dwelling" (Zechariah 2:10-13).

Many of us have spent the last year reading through Poetry (Book of Psalms) and Prophecy (the Major Old Testament Prophets and the Book of Revelation). Many of these readings have been unsettling and challenging, but also inspiring and hopeful.

In Zechariah chapter two, the prophet shares an image of inspiration and hope. The Lord will come and dwell in our midst. God will be with us. And as we await God's coming, we are called to a simple task, "Be silent!" Well, maybe that's not quite such a simple task after all. Seeking silence in a noisy world can be a difficult endeavor. Silence takes intention, thoughtfulness, and practice.

A few simple practices in the pursuit of silence may include:

Setting aside intentional times of quiet, in which you don't speak Commuting without the news, music, or a podcast Exercising (running) without ear buds or headphones Taking a social media Sabbath Scheduling a silent retreat at a retreat center.

During this reflective season of Advent, I have disengaged from social media, in order to more fully engage in personal devotion, prayer, and silence. My soul has felt the difference. I find that my mind is less cluttered, and my prayers are more focused.

I invite you to take a quiet moment this day to ponder what simple practice in the pursuit of silence may be good for your soul.

Kristina -Revised budget at \$292,000 to cut back board & ministries, and cut out youth from the budget, (they have a large fund at the moment). Staff salaries have been increased. Video tech is for three people. Operating expenses, water is the same but increased gas and telephone has been decreased because of the new phone services electricity have been decreased as well and contracted services have been dropped, custodial supplies have dropped, other things have mostly stayed the same. 
