If you would like to submit a question for "Ask the Pastor", Biblical, theological, church related, anything you have been dying to ask a pastor, you can hand me a note, ask me after church, send an e-mail, or sneak into the church after dark and anonymously slide a sealed envelope under my office door. If I answer your question in print, I will not include your name unless you explicitly ask me to.

Ask the Pastor

"Did Jesus Have Brothers and Sisters?"

"During one of our Gospel discussions in worship, the question of Jesus' brothers and sisters came up (our Gospel reading that week was Mark 3:20-35). The question was asked, "Did Jesus really have brothers and sisters? How?"

The first part of the question is easy to answer... According to the Gospel of Mark, Jesus had four brothers (at least four that are mentioned by name) and sisters too. (The Greek word used in the Bible for brothers, adelphoi, can mean either "brothers" or "brothers and sisters;" statistically, five male children and no female children in a family would be rare, so "sisters" are a safe assumption.) These siblings are mentioned several different places in the Bible. (see Mark 3:31-31, Luke 8:19-21, Mark 6:3, John 7:1-10)

Based on these passages, Jesus' brothers (and sisters) probably did not follow him during his lifetime. In our Gospel reading from Mark, Jesus' family thought he was crazy and may have attempted to restrain him from his preaching and healing activities. However, after his death, the book of Acts says that his brothers and his mother were part of the earliest group of post-crucifixion Jesus-followers. In addition, one of Jesus' brothers, James, became a leader in that early community while Jesus' other brothers went on preaching journeys on behalf of the community.

The "How?" part of the question is more complicated... In the Apostles' Creed we confess that "Jesus was born of the virgin Mary." So, the question is, did Mary remain a virgin or did she and Joseph only refrain from marital relations until after Jesus was born? The answer depends on your theology and piety...

Some Christians believe in the "perpetual virginity of Mary." That is, Mary was a virgin when Jesus was born, and she was always a virgin. They explain that Jesus' brothers and sisters were the children of Joseph from a previous marriage. There is an entire backstory of Joseph's being significantly older than Mary, having been previously married, having multiple children, and then being widowed AND THEN marrying Mary. Unfortunately, this doesn't have much biblical basis. An additional problem with this is that the Bible does not even hint that Joseph was married or had children before he married Mary. If Joseph already had half a dozen children before he met Mary, why are they not mentioned in Joseph and Mary's trip to Bethlehem (Luke 2:4-7) or their trip to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15) or their trip back to Nazareth (Matthew 2:20-23)?

Another suggestion is that these "brothers" were actually Jesus' cousins. In a small town, in a time when people didn't travel far from home, children of the same age may have been raised together and thought of each other as 'brothers.' However, in the above examples, the specific Greek word for "brother" is used. While the word can refer to other relatives, its normal and literal meaning is a biological brother. There was a different Greek word for "cousin" that would have described this small town, extended family relation, but it was not used. There is nothing in the context of Jesus' mother and brothers coming to see him that even hints that they were anyone other than his literal brothers.

Still another suggestion is that that these siblings are the actual children of Joseph and Mary, younger siblings of Jesus. Considering the unusual circumstances of Jesus conception and birth, perhaps they would technically be half-brothers and half-sisters of Jesus (but that's a discussion for another time). After Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph lived as a normal married couple. They shared the marriage bed, they had more children, and raised their family. That seems to be suggested in Matthew 1:25; "but [Joseph] had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus." But of course, there is nothing in scripture that can prove or disprove this point of view either.



Faith Practice #3 Readings Job

The Book of Job, grouped with the "poetry and wisdom" books in the Old Testament, explores themes of suffering, faith, and the nature of God's justice. The story is set in the land of Uz and centers around Job, a blameless and upright man who fears God and shuns evil.

The narrative begins with a description of Job's prosperity and piety, yet the Adversary appears before God and argues that Job is faithful only because of his prosperity. God allows the Adversary to test Job by taking away his possessions, children, and health, but forbids him from taking Job's life. Despite his immense suffering, Job does not curse God but instead laments his misfortune.

His lament sets the stage for a series of dialogues between Job and his friends. They engage in a series of speeches, arguing that Job's suffering must be a punishment for some hidden sin. Job maintains his innocence and argues that his suffering is unjust.

At the end of the book God finally answers Job out of a whirlwind. Rather than providing a direct explanation for Job's suffering, God highlights the vastness and complexity of creation, emphasizing his own omnipotence and the limitations of human understanding. Through a series of rhetorical questions, God makes it clear that his ways and purposes are beyond human comprehension.

The Book of Job is a powerful exploration of the human condition, the mystery of suffering, and the nature of faith in the face of inexplicable adversity. It challenges simplistic notions of divine justice and encourages a humble acknowledgment of the limits of human understanding.




