### Ask the Pastor

When will our new Faith Practice Readings start for the New Year?



The Book of Isaiah spans a time of political crisis, moral decline, and looming judgment, but also carries a profound message of hope, redemption, and God's ultimate plan for salvation. Although Jewish and Christian tradition attributes the whole book to the prophet Isaiah of Jerusalem (8th century BCE), many scholars believe Isaiah was written by multiple authors over different periods. Isaiah can be divided into three main sections or eras...

1. First Isaiah (Chapters 1–39) - "Isaiah of Jerusalem"  
This is traditionally attributed to the historical prophet Isaiah, who lived in Judah in the 8th century BCE. It focuses on warning Judah and Jerusalem about social injustice, idolatry, and the threat of Assyria.
2. Second Isaiah (Chapters 40–55) - "Deutero-Isaiah"  
This section was likely written during the Babylonian exile (6th century BCE), centuries after Isaiah's lifetime. These chapters emphasize comfort, hope, and restoration, addressing exiled Israelites. Here we find the Suffering Servant and the promise of return from exile.
3. Third Isaiah (Chapters 56–66) - "Trito-Isaiah"  
These chapters seem to have been written after the exile (late 6th century BCE or early 5th century BCE). They focus on life in the restored community, social justice, worship, and the future glory of God's kingdom.

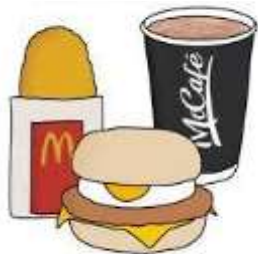


### **The "Blanket Ladies" gather to make quilts on Tuesday mornings at 9:00 am.**

Stewardship is caring for all that God has given us—  
ourselves, our time, our possessions, the  
earth and all creation, our community both close and  
worldwide. We know this very well; we hear it in  
church repeatedly. But too often God’s call to stew-  
ardship is lost in the hustle and bustle of our every-  
day lives. We are overwhelmed with what’s going on  
in the world, in our community, in our church,  
in our families, and in ourselves.

And we’re caught up in the  
contemporary cultural passion to possess. Indeed,  
70% of the US Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is  
buying stuff. Our economy depends on our fetish that  
“more is better.” We’re so caught up in it all, that we  
don’t know how to exit the rollercoaster  
and reclaim a slower, more purposeful  
life journey together with God.

*“Christian simplicity frees us from this modern mania.*

*It brings sanity to our compulsive  
extravagance, and peace to our frantic spirit...People  
once again become more important than posses-  
sions, enabling us to live lives of integrity in the face  
of the terrible realities of our  
global village.”*

Simplicity is eliminating the noise in our lives to allow  
us to focus on the important role that

God calls us to be—caring stewards of our lives and  
our world. Simplicity is a grace, because it is a gift  
from God. Simplicity is a discipline, because we are  
called to do something. But simplicity isn’t simple. It  
takes time, effort, and balance. The potential result,  
however, is restoration of soul and relationship with  
others and with the environment.

Let’s make our 2026 theme for Stewardship “Living  
Simply.” Each month, let’s consider a

different aspect of simplicity, starting with inward  
characteristics—like prayer and solitude—and mov-  
ing to outward characteristics—like consumerism  
and wellness. You’ll be challenged to accept God’s  
gift of simplicity and practice the discipline as well.

As individuals and as a congregation, we can be  
better stewards of what God has given us.

We just need to try, simply.

## Welcome to 2026: The Way of Love!

As our scripture verse for this year reminds us,

**“We love because he first loved us.” (1 John 4:19).**

As we journey together with Jesus, we have the great opportunity to encourage each other to grow in both our appreciation for, and reflection of, the love of God.

### WHAT IS LOVE Bishop Daniel Beaudoin

We love because he first loved us.” (1 John 4:19)

What is Love? Love is a gift from God that calls us to imitate the self-giving love of Jesus, which transforms us, to transform the community and the world!

In July, 2000, I was blessed to gather with over 35,000 young people for the ELCA Youth Gathering in St. Louis, Missouri. One of the main speakers was Archbishop Desmond Tutu from South Africa. It was at this gathering where I first heard about the South African principle of "Ubuntu" which is translated, "I am because we are." Archbishop Tutu taught us that when the love of God is combined with the power of "we," the result is the healing and transformation of the community and the world. The Apostle John understands both the gift of God's love and the power of "we".

In 1 John 4:7-19, John teaches the community of faith that God is love, and as followers of Jesus we are called to imitate God's self-giving love, not only as individuals, but also as a community of faith. Notice that 1 John 4:19, does not begin with a "me", but with a "we". "We" are called to love, in the same way that God, in Christ Jesus, loves us. The love that John writes about is a love that begins with God, a love that we are called to imitate: a love that changes the community and the world.

In his book, *Love Is the Way: Holding on to Hope in Troubling Times*, Episcopal Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, helps us to put God's self-giving love into perspective. He simply asks, "Is this love about me, or is it about we?" Does the decision that I am about to make serve my own self-interest, or might this decision serve the greater good?

If the answer is "me, myself, and I," the way of love calls us to reconsider our next step. According to Presiding Bishop Curry, Archbishop Tutu, the Apostle John, and Jesus, we embrace the "we" before the "me," for that is the way of love. And it can be that simple... and also that challenging.

But at the end of the day, love is the only way. "We love because He first loved us".

1. In 1 John 4:7-19, the writer reminds the church about the self-giving love of God. How is this self-giving love lived out in your community of faith?

2. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, the Apostle John, and Jesus all call us to a love that puts the "we" before the "me". Why do you think this self-giving love is so challenging for us to live out? Can you share a story of a time you experienced this kind of love in your life? In the life of your parish?

*Let us pray: Gracious and Loving God, we thank you for the gift of Your love, and we seek Your forgiveness, when we fail to love as we are loved. Fill us with Your gentle and self-giving love, so that we might share it with others. Empower us to forgive, to serve, and to follow you in the way of love. Lead us to share Your love with our neighbor and the world, transforming us from who we are, into the people You long for us to be. In the name of Jesus, crucified and risen for the world. Amen.*

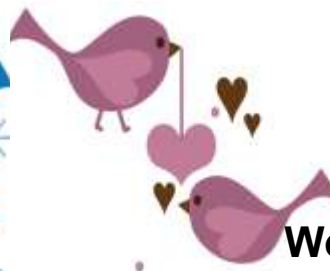
