

Ask the Pastor



"How (and when) does my child get First Communion instruction?"

Around the time of COVID (perhaps even before) it was difficult to get young people together for First Communion classes. During the pandemic, we couldn't have an official 'class' but I didn't want to neglect the importance of instruction before receiving the sacrament. Therefore, I put together a packet of information based on the lessons I had previously used, combined with some additional outside materials. With the packet, parent(s) and child could work through the lessons in their own time. When the packet was competed and parents felt like their child understood the lessons, I would meet with them and discuss/review some of the highlights (Christ's presence, grace, forgiveness, etc.) and review the practical aspects of receiving Holy Communion. After meeting with the pastor, the student was able to receive their first communion whenever they and their parents were ready.

So, a question for parents of children who have not received First Communion instruction: what method/approach would work best for you and your family? Would you like me to try to schedule a class sometime in the next few months? Or would it be more convenient to keep using the packets and working on the materials at home? I am interested in receiving your feedback.

To the question of "when?" The short answer is, "after Baptism", but I'm sure that's not very helpful. Practices have varied throughout church history and among Lutherans. For most of Christian history, ALL baptized members of the church were invited to the Lord's Table every time they gathered for worship. (Still today in Orthodox churches newborn infants are brought forward in a parent's arms and the priest touches a crumb of bread and a spoon of wine to the child's lips.) Sometime in the 12th Century, Roman Catholics considered age 7 as the "age of reason" so that's when they did instruction. In the time of Martin Luther, First Communion was celebrated at the same time as Confirmation. That practice continued among American Lutherans until the 1980s when the church published a study separating First Communion and confirmation and began inviting children to commune at a younger age.

Ask the Pastor-Continued

In 1997 the ELCA adopted a statement called **"The Use of the Means of Grace" that discusses** how we deal with the sacraments, scripture, and worship in general. It includes this statement regarding the age for First Communion...

Application 37C -- "Baptized children begin to commune on a regular basis at a time determined through mutual conversation that includes the pastor, the child, and the parents or sponsors involved, within the accepted practices of the congregation. Ordinarily this beginning will occur only when children can eat and drink, and can start to respond to the gift of Christ in the Supper."

The reasoning behind this is that since we baptize people regardless of age, we should consider communing people regardless of age. Holy Communion, like Baptism, comes to us as a gift of faith. God is the primary actor in the sacrament and our role is to receive and believe. Therefore, the effectiveness of Holy Communion is not dependent on us, but wholly upon God. Christ promises his presence for us and we have a need for his presence regardless of age.

Back to the question, "when should my child receive their first communion?" The 'best' way to determine if a child is ready is "through mutual conversation that includes the pastor, the child, and the parents or sponsors". If you feel your child is ready to receive communion instruction, please make an appointment to speak with me. Some parents have found it helpful to begin working through the packet first and then determining if their child is ready.

Adults/parents of older children, if you have questions or thoughts about First Communion, please make an appointment to speak with me. If you would be interested in taking a more **detailed look at "The Use of the Means of Grace" specifically the parts about Holy** Communion to gain a better understand of Lutheran faith practices, please speak with me about a time we could form a study group.

From Pastor O'Brien

This December I am going to be reading the book, **"The Advent** Conspiracy: Making Christmas **Meaningful (Again)"** and I would like to invite you to join me.

From their website: Advent Conspiracy shows you how to substitute consumption with compassion by practicing four simple but powerful, countercultural concepts: Worship Fully because Christmas begins and ends with Jesus. Spend Less—and free your resources for things that truly matter. Give More—of your presence: your hands, your words, your time, your heart. Love All—the poor, the forgotten, the marginalized, and the sick in ways that make a difference. Find out how to have a Christmas worth remembering, not dreading. Christmas can still change the world when you, like Jesus, give what matters most—your presence.

The four concepts of Worship Fully, Spend Less, Give More, and Love All seem like nice reminders as I prepare for Christmas and I think they would fit well with our Reverse Advent Calendar Project too.

If you are interested, the book is available on Amazon for \$9.00 https://a.co/d/gIJOdVc (\$5.99 for Kindle) It may also be available at your local library, but I have not verified.

How are we going to read the book together? At the very least, I would like to create space for discussion on our St. John Williston - Online Community Facebook group. (https:// www.facebook.com/ groups/3270411673060044)

This is accessible to anyone who has a Facebook account regardless of location and mobility. I plan to post questions based on a couple of chapters at a time throughout Advent. I am also open to meeting for an in-person **discussion group like we did for "The Journey"** last year. This could be morning or evening, at the church or a different location (a local restau**rant, a park, someone's home, etc.).** We could meet once to discuss the entire book, or make it more of a short-term study group during the four weeks of Advent. Take a look at the book, maybe read the first chapter, and let me know what sort of gathering you would be interested in.

However you choose to participate (or not) in discussion with your church friends, I hope you will consider reading the book.

If you would like to submit a question for "Ask the Pastor", Biblical, theological, church related, anything you have been dying to ask a pastor, you can hand me a note, ask me after church, send an e-mail, or sneak into the church after dark and anonymously slide a sealed envelope under my office door. If I answer your question in print, I will not include your name unless you explicitly ask me to.



How many of you are familiar with an Advent Calendar?

The idea dates back to the German Lutherans in the1800s. It is based on the tradition of writing chalk tally marks on walls or lighting candles to count the remaining days until Christmas. Modern Advent calendars help you count down the days by either moving a little star on a calendar or opening up a little pocket or box to reveal a tiny gift (or moving Hans Gruber down the Nakatomi Plaza). Since they were very little, we have gotten chocolate Advent calendars for our kids. (Actually, that's something we still do.) Each day they can open the numbered window and count down the days until Christmas with a piece of chocolate. One year we even found an Advent calendar filled with dog treats. I doubt Fancy understood the sentiment, but she was glad to have a daily treat.

This year, I would like you to consider participating in a twist on that idea... a Reverse Advent Calendar. Instead of taking something out for yourself, the idea is to put something in or set something aside to give to someone else– thus giving instead of getting. There are boxes and calendars listing different items for each day until Christmas available at the church. Or you can print a calendar from the newsletter or Facebook and use your own box from home. At the end of Advent, the reverse calendar will result in a collection of 24 items that can be dropped off at the church to support a good cause at Christmas time.


The calendar we have created supports the needs pantry at the **Advent Lutheran Center and the LIGHT Neighborhood Pantry at Elliston Zion.**

The **Advent Lutheran Center** is one of five day programs operated by Luther Home of Mercy. Here, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities socialize with others, interact with the community and learn new skills. When this site opened several years ago, there was a strong desire by participants to give back to their community through volunteering. However, they discovered many places are not willing or able to accommodate persons with disabilities as volunteers and the offer to help was frequently declined.

That did not deter the Advent participants... instead, they opened their own personal needs pantry. (They believe this to be a first-of-its-kind program in Ohio and a true celebration of the positive community spirit of those they serve.) This project is largely funded by the individuals themselves, their families, and the staff who work there. They are not always able to keep up with the community demand for products. Our help enables the participants to keep the pantry open and keep offering smiles and needed items to others.

The Light Neighborhood Pantry at Elliston Zion is open to all residents of Ottawa Country struggling with food insecurity. They are a free local choice food pantry where clients can select the items they want and will use. The pantry can get many food items from the Toledo NWO Food Bank, but hygiene and personal need items are rarely available. Our help enables them to provide these items for the people they serve. On average, the LIGHT Neighborhood Pantry serves 25-40 families each month and serves dinner once a month to as many as 70 people. The LIGHT Neighborhood Pantry is open on the 2nd Weds. of each month from 5-7 PM and is also available in emergency circumstances. They also have a partnership with the Blessing Box here at St. John to share items they have in abundance with our community.

Our Reverse Advent Calendars will support both organizations when they are filled. Also this year our Christmas offering will be designated to support our neighbors as they meet these community needs. You will hear more about these ministries in the season of Advent.

In Psalm 46, we are reminded that God is with us, and especially present in times of pain and peril.


