"Synoptic Gospels" is another way to talk about the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. You may have noticed that these three Gospels have quite a bit of shared material. Their narratives are similar enough that scholars have grouped them together under the title of "Synoptic Gospels." In essence, the word synoptic conveys a harmonious or similar feel. (I included a graphic that displays some information about how much is shared and which Gospels share so you can see the idea in pie graph form. I thought was rather interesting and maybe be helpful with what's below.)

So, the next question might be "why do they have so much shared material?" The honest answer is, we don't know.

Some scholars suggest that the earliest Gospel, probably Mark, was available to the other Gospel writers, so the other two used this material and filled in their own story. But that doesn't explain the material that is unique to Matthew and Luke.

Other scholars have suggested that they all used material from a third source; a hypothetical document of oral tradition, sayings, etc. that could have given non-eyewitness gospel writers, such as Luke, some firsthand accounts of Jesus' ministry. Scholars refer to this as the "Q Source". But this remains a theory as we have no record of a Q Source.

Some of the early Church Fathers said Matthew came first, Mark is a summary of Matthew, and Luke copied Matthew. But that doesn't explain the material that is unique to Luke and Mark (which isn't much, but it does exist.) Plus, modern scholars think Mark was likely written first.

The difficulty in explaining the similarities and differences among the Synoptic Gospels is referred to as the Synoptic Problem, which I'm not going to try to solve in a newsletter article. But hopefully the above gives you a glimpse of the issues.

In my view, the Synoptic "Problem" is not really much of a problem at all. It's obvious the three Gospel writers share a tradition (oral or written) and each one used the material to share their own unique story of the Good News of Jesus. Depending on their audience, their setting, their own experience, etc. they each had an account they needed to tell, points they needed to highlight, emphasizes they needed to make. Studying the differences to understand how the Luke Gospel Church was different from the Matthew Gospel Church may be a better response that trying to "solve a problem" and make them all match.






