

Ask the Pastor

"What is the difference between a PASTOR and a REVEREND?

"What is the difference between a PASTOR and a REVEREND? Which are you?" I actually get this question quite frequently. I'm not quite as eloquent when answering on the fly, but I like Rolf Jacobson's definition of PASTOR in his book "Crazy Talk"; A PASTOR is "a sinner who is so aware of the power of sin in his or her own life that he or she feels called by the Holy Spirit to announce that God loves sinners." A great definition, but it probably doesn't answer the original question, so we will get technical... PASTOR comes from the Latin word for shepherd. Throughout the Bible, the image of sheep and shepherd are used for God and God's people; Psalm 23 is one of the first to jump to mind. We also read that God asks those called to take care of his "sheep." An example is at the end of John's Gospel where the risen Jesus commands Peter: "Feed my sheep." In this sense, PASTORS are shepherds of God's flock. (I prefer to think of myself more like an assistant shepherd, maybe like a sheep dog, for THE Shepherd, but that's for another time.)

REVERAND is a title of respect for members of the clergy. It carries the meaning of someone who is worthy reverence. (Interesting aside... when I was preparing for my ordination, the Bishop referred to me as "The Almost-Reverend O'Brien" since I wasn't yet officially clergy. Some

would argue that title is appropriate even now.) Finally, to the question, "Which are you?" the answer is both. REVEREND is a title. Because I have been ordained in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in American and I am a member of the clergy, I am Reverend Shawn O'Brien. PASTOR is a relationship. Because I am (an assistant to the) shepherd of God's flock at St. John Lutheran Church in Williston, I am Pastor Shawn O'Brien.



If you would like to submit a question for "Ask the Pastor", Biblical, theological, church related, anything you have been dying to ask a pastor, you can hand me a note, ask me after church, send an e-mail, or sneak into the church after dark and anonymously slide a sealed envelope under my office door. If I answer your question in print, I will not include your name unless you explicitly ask me to.


Bed sheets (Queen size) are needed for quilt backings. Donations may be left in the box outside the church office.





Rogation Days 2025

Dear Friends in Christ,

Rogation Days are quickly approaching. Rogation comes from the Latin "rogare" which means to beseech or to ask. On the festival of the Ascension (Christ ascending/returning to heaven) we beseech God's blessing for the seed, for the soil, for those who labor in the fields and for all of God's creation.

Rogation Days is an ancient church blessing of farmers, farms, farm animals, and farm equipment, around the time of Ascension Day (40 days after Easter). Starting in Europe during the time of the Reformation, church leaders would bless the ground, and animals that would provide the food at the fall harvest. Many of our congregations celebrate harvest days in the fall; we also do the same at the beginning of the cycle of planting, growing, and feeding what will produce that harvest in the fall.

We have heard from one church member, "My grandfather never planted a seed until after Ascension Day." This idea certainly comes from the European tradition of Rogation Days. While times have changed and planting is dictated by different metrics, receiving the gift of God's blessing, for the creation of food for God's people, is a metric that is timeless. The pastors of the North Central Conference (Wood and Ottawa Counties) would like to join together to present our second annual Rogation Days and Ascension Day festival.

The dates for the rogation blessings will be May 27 and 28. A Rogation Day blessing has been made available to all pastoral leaders in the conference. If you would like to receive a blessing of fields, gardens, livestock, and/or equipment, contact your pastor or SAM. If your congregation's pastoral leader is not available for a blessing, contact our Conference Dean, Pastor Shawn O'Brien (pastorobrien@stjohnwilliston.org or call/text 419-378-1112) and he will coordinate with an area pastor to schedule a blessing.

Thursday May 29, is Ascension Day. The entire North Central Conference is invited to a special dinner and worship service at Solomon Lutheran church in Woodville, Ohio. **Worship will begin at 6:00p with dinner following** (7:00p-ish). Please set some time away from your work to join us for a time of blessing and renewal. We are asking congregations to sign people up locally and report expected attendance to Solomon Lutheran Church (email: srewoldt@solomon.pvt.k12.oh.us or call the church office at 419-849-3600) by May 19.

Leader of Simply Worship at Epiphany, Toledo

Simply Worship is a unique worship service offered weekly at Epiphany Lutheran Church that is designed specifically to enhance participation for people with developmental disabilities. The songs are simple expressions of faith, simple language is used throughout and the message is designed to address the experiences of those who live in group homes and participate in activities in the community. People of all abilities are invited to light candles, welcome visitors and share their talents in this community of faith. One of the favorite songs of the gathered is the African-American spiritual, He's Got the Whole World in His Hands. Pastor Steve notes, "Especially in the context of anyone who may be marginalized, in this case the developmentally disabled, this song is a wonderful reminder that we all share a common source, God."

From the Bishop....

At the end of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus encourages His followers to be both hearers and doers of the word (Matthew 7:24-27). Jesus calls us to listen and to act. Have you ever considered the call of Jesus to listen as a Lenten discipline? During this Year of Listening, I

encourage you to seek out intentional ways to listen to God, to listen to others, and to listen to your community.

Listening to God through Scripture, prayer, and silence helps us to connect with the ways and the will of the Living God. Listening to God helps us to hear what is right and true, which is a stark contrast to so much of what we hear on social media, radio talk shows, and from our political leaders. Listening to others through study and deliberation helps us to connect with the people God has placed in our lives. The journey of faith (including the discipline of Lent) is not a solo act, but a corporate opportunity. Please take some time during this Lenten season to engage in Bible study or participate in a prayer group to simply listen to the hopes and fears of those who are a part of your parish. Are there ways that you might work together to bring the tangible love of God to your faith community? I think of the two women who started a widow's group in our parish to help those who were grieving to experience love and support. It is in these corporate

contemplative and quiet moments that we hear the voice of God speak through those who are near to us. Listening to the community through service and generosity helps us to connect with our neighbors. We are called by Jesus to love God and to love our neighbor. And we love best by listening, and especially listening to those who are frightened, anxious, and suffering. How might we seek tangible ways to bring healing and hope to those who are vulnerable and in need? Many of our parishes offer food pantries, community meals, 12-step groups, and opportunities to learn the English language. How might you find a way to listen, to love, and to walk with those in need in our communities? 2025 is the year of Listening in the Northwestern Ohio Synod. How might listening serve as a Lenten discipline for you and your community?

Our team has prepared for you an entire catalog of 2025 Year of Listening Resources that we hope will accompany you in individual and parish exploration of this year of listening.

Council Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes from January 16, 2025 was made by Deanna Neuman and 2nd by Cheryl Berger. Motion passed. Motion to approve the 2025 Annual Meeting Minutes corrected as listed was made by Dave Neuman. 2nd by Jennifer Nelson- motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Worship Attendance: In Person average for February 2025-101.8 compared to February 2024-108.5. Online average for February 2025-105.5 compared to February 2024-65.5. Numbers-12 hospital/ home-bound visits/individual or family meeting. 4 committee/group meetings 4 community/youth/ fellowship events.6 professional/clergy activities. Midweek Lent-Our theme for midweek Lenten worship this year is listening. Worship is on Wednesdays at 11:00 with lunch following. There are three remaining March 26, April 2nd and April 9. Financial Secretary, Treasurer & Finance Committee Report: Income: We are 116% of our monthly budget and 101% of our year-to-date budget. Expenses: We are 94% of the monthly budget and 95% of the yearto-date budget. Our Video Tech Committee has requested the purchase of 3 new computers for \$4100. Please submit any scholarship applications by the end of March. 
